About Commissioner Larry Johnson

Commissioner Larry Johnson was elected as the DeKalb 3rd District Commissioner in November 2002 with the overwhelming support of the community. He won with 92 percent of the vote, making him one of the youngest Commissioners elected to serve on the Board of Commissioners. Commissioner Johnson's leadership is exemplified in many ways including services that benefit youth, seniors and improved public health. His commitment to helping children succeed is evidenced by his selection as Chair of the Early Learning/School Readiness Commission and his nomination to serve on the Early Education Commission. Commissioner Johnson is a long-term advocate of health and health-related initiatives. Accordingly, he spearheaded "DeKalb Walks...For the Health of It!" where he designated walking as the official exercise of DeKalb --- the only locality in Georgia or the U.S. to do so. His commitment to health further captured the attention of First Lady Michelle Obama and he was invited to be involved with her national "Let's Move!" campaign. In 2005, Commissioner Larry Johnson was appointed to chair the Health Disparities Subcommittee of the Health Steering Committee of NACo, the National Association of Counties. He has continued to work in number of leadership capacities with NACo from 2005 to the present, including his current role as Chair of the Health Steering Committee. Commissioner Johnson graduated from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign with a BS in Community Health and later earned his Masters in Public Health from the University of Northern Colorado.
