

Information and Links about Liver Transplants

Thank you for your interest in the Liver Transplant program and specifically the Living Donor Program at UCSF.

The goal of the program is to save lives while protecting the welfare of the donor. Each time a living donor donates part of his/her liver for transplant, two patients are benefited: The recipient of the donated liver and a second recipient who will receive a deceased donor liver that would have otherwise been used by the donor recipient.

You need to be between 25 and 60 (no exceptions) and have type A or O Blood (They will test for type)
