Dr. Stephen Ettinger is a renowned veterinarian, boarded veterinary cardiologist, and best-selling text book author. In 1971, he co-founded

the Berkeley Veterinary Medical Group, the first group specialty practice in the U.S. He is founder/prior owner of California Animal Hospital and former Chief Medical Officer of PetDRx. He served as Clinical Professor, Veterinary Medicine, at UC Davis and was a Visiting Professor at the Veterinary School at the University of Sydney. Dr. Ettinger co-authored with Dr. P.F. Suter the first veterinary small animal specialty textbook, Canine Cardiology (1971), and he has been author/editor of the Textbook of Veterinary Internal Medicine. He has served on the Board of Trustees at Cornell University and holds memberships at the CVMA, the American College of Cardiology and the American Heart Association. He completed a NIH Postdoctoral Fellow in Cardiology, is Diplomat of the ACVIM (C and IM), and a Fellow (FACC) of the American College of Cardiology and the American Heart Association (FAHA). Dr. Ettinger's areas of expertise include small animal veterinary internal medicine and cardiology, hospital management and professional veterinary development. Dr. Ettinger practices at VCA All-Care Animal Referral Center and also works with animal health companies.

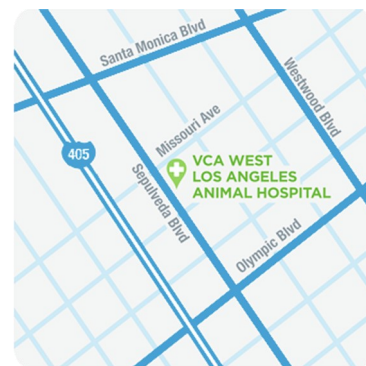
