This policy specifically establishes the procedures to follow in order to institute a clear guiding principle on administration of medications for child care facilities.

The information in this class is intend for classroom improvements for all types of child care centers (TYPE I, II or II)

Cognitive development involves the way children learn, acquire knowledge and interact with their surrounding environment. Children are growing, learning and absorbing so many things before they can even talk. Research has shown that children’s early learning experiences are critically important in stimulating and enhancing their overall brain growth and development. The cognitive development journey of these young learners begins with brain-boosting hands-on exploring, discovering, examining and creating. This session is designed to provide teachers with insights about specific ways to stimulate and promote children’s early thinking, reasoning, understanding and intellectual skills.
