Now that your child has turned three, early intervention services are now called **Special Education** and **Related Services**. The transition from receiving services via an IFSP to an IEP can become quite perplexing initially. There is a difference in the delivery of services by Early steps (Part C) versus the local public school district (Part B).

Each state is responsible for ensuring that every child receiving early intervention services transition without delay. As a parent myself, I visually could not make the connection until I researched and began to learn that it is a baffling process, learning my role not just as a parent — but as a leader and advocate to ensure that my son receives a free and appropriate education as stated in the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act — IDEA.
