Candidate Guidelines for the ASA-DOJ Scholarship

ASA-DOJ is privileged to provide educational scholarships to deserving recipients. The following information outlines the guidelines to qualify for this scholarship.

Purpose:

The ASA-DOJ scholarship fund was established to help provide ASA-DOJ members and their dependants the opportunity to attend a college or

Eligibility Requirements:

The applicant must be a member of ASA-DOJ), the spouse of a member or a dependant of a member (continuous CSLEA membership of at least one year before submitting application). Dependant is a child or step child.

NOTE: Non-member fee payers and retirees or their families are not eligible.

Qualifications:

- 1. The applicant shall have a minimum grade point average of 3.0. Transcripts shall be submitted with the application.
- 2. The applicant shall have an application pending or be enrolled in a college or university. In the event an applicant does not enter a college or university in the year the scholarship is awarded, he/she will reimburse the award to the ASA-DOJ Scholarship Fund.
- 3. Each applicant must submit a one page typed autobiography describing his or her future life and educational goals and explaining why he or she is deserving of a scholarship.
- 4. The applicant shall submit two letters of recommendation from a teacher, professor or school counselor.
- 5. The applicant will submit a photograph (size 2 inches by 2 inches) with his/her application.

Scholarship Application Review Committee:

The ASA-DOJ President will appoint individuals to act as a committee to review the applications.

The term of the appointment will be for one year from January 1 through December 31 of each calendar year. The ASA-DOJ President will select one person of the five appointed to act as chair-

Selection of Scholarship Recipients:

- A. An application packet will be prepared for each applicant. Each packet will contain a cover sheet or essay noting academic achievements, grade point average, community activities and background biography.
- B. Each application will be assigned a random case number.
- C. Upon review of the application packets, each committee member will complete an "Application Assessment Sheet." A score of one to 10 points (10 is the highest) will be granted for (1) academic achievements, (2) community activities and (3) merit. The assessment sheets will be totaled and the highest scores will be awarded scholarships. The dollar amount and the number of scholarships awareded will depend on the money raised and donated to the scholarship fund during the fiscal
- D. An application that does not meet all of the minimum qualifications will be rejected.
