A Year of Giving & Care - & Share



We are an organization set up to give and we do charity well. Exalted Ruler Ed Snelling has developed Elks 270 charitable giving as a ways and means to support our community as well as grow our organization. Those two goals work hand in hand. Under his leadership, our membership and food and beverage revenues have grown right along side our charitable giving. In October 2014, our leadership committed to sharing the net proceeds from food sales one week a month with a deserving local charity. We call it Make One Meal Matter. Since then, the average monthly contribution is \$1,000 and is given to all sorts of organizations including Elks National Foundation, cancer research, New Albany's D.A.R.E program, St. Elizabeth's, Arts Council, and Exit Zero.

In March of 2015, we supported the New Albany Parks and Recreation by donating \$5,000 to buy new equipment. We've supported local business by joining Develop New Albany and donating \$2,000 towards the Jingle Bell Walk and Holiday Fest, which by the way drew a couple hundred people into the lodge for the afternoon and generated several new member applications. We spent over \$1,300 at locally owned Destinations Booksellers in support of the Book Buddies Reading program at S Ellen Jones and Fairmont Schools.

One of our most generous contributions over the last year was to Hope Southern Indiana. Elks 270 committed to a total of \$12,000 towards their Snack Attack program which provides after school snacks and homework help to kids in need throughout

Of course our flagship program, Clothe A Child, is our largest contribution of the year. In 2014 and 2015 we raised enough money to clothe over 140 kids each year. This well established program is beloved within 270 and we often hear "It's all about the kids" from our members. The joy of giving over \$23,000 each holiday season is seen not only on the kid's faces but also on the members faces who play golf, shop, wrap, cook, and serve the kids and their families.



We've supported our Veterans by donating \$1,000 to the "Stand Down" program which provides services to veteran's families, Pegasus Pin sales allowed a \$2,405 donation to the VA Hospital. Our commitment to local veteran's includes partnering with the National Guard Armory by providing parties and meals to the troops and their families. Our support of New Albany High School's Jr ROTC, totaling over \$3,000 is viewed as supporting future veterans.

Our annual donations to Elks National Foundation and the Indiana Elks are a constant as well. And then there are the countless smaller donations including funds to help an Eagle Scout with his final project, New Albany Little League sponsorship, Retired Senior Volunteers, and tickets for the kids to attend the annual Kosair Shrine Circus.

In total, we've donated over \$80.000 since October of 2014. Thank you to all the members of Elks 270. You are an organization that stands true to it's mission of "serving people and communities through benevolent programs, demonstrating that Elks Care, Elks Share.

Annie is a well-loved Elk and that's as it should be. She met her beloved husband, Walter in college where she graduated with a degree in Home Economics and entered the workplace as a Norton's Hospital dietician in 1959. They joined the Elks when Walter was transferred to a job in the Elsby Building in the early 1960s and made the Lodge his social center. Annie acted as The Lady Elks president for many years before be-



coming one of the first women initiated to Lodge 270 in the mid 1990s.

At its' inception Annie adopted Clothe A Child as her favorite project. From that first year through last year, Annie has played a major role in this holiday tradition. She co-ordinates the schools and families and then directs the shopping at Wal Mart. She's given over 50 years of service to our community and we wouldn't know what to do without her.

She and Walter ran a farm in Harrison County raising Saler cattle. She still lives in her farmhouse and manages 5 acres of land all by herself. She shares those skills by volunteering with the Harrison County extension office teaches and raises funds for the Head Start Reading Program. She considers herself a fulltime volunteer since her retirement from teaching in 1995.

When Walter died in 2005, Annie stepped up to replace him as Lodge Chaplain and has enjoyed that role ever since. Her son Henry grew up at the Lodge back in the days when kids hung out and explored downtown New Albany while the parents played cards. She misses those days. Henry, a 25 year #270 member himself, has given her 2 grand kids who live in Kansas City but love their annual Thanksgiving visit to the farm. Thank You Annie For All You Do.
