# NEW FEE SCHEDULE AND PERMITTING APPLICATIONS:

With a new year comes a new fee schedule – notable changes include new *permitting fees, field rental charges,* and *residential sewer rates.* Our fee schedule is always readily available on the home page of our website at the very top of the page. While you're on our website, take a look at our newly designed and user-friendly permit applications.

## **CREDIT CARD TRANSACTION FEES:**

The Township will no longer be covering the extra costs associated with credit card transactions, which could often times soar to more than \$500 per month. Please consider another form of payment for your purchases, such as check or cash. Those who still wish to pay via credit card will be charged a 1.79% service charge fee.

# BOARD OF SUPERVISORS WORK SESSION MEETING CHANGE:

The Board of Supervisors recently changed its public meeting schedule. Gone are the Monday morning Work Session meetings. The Board will now conduct its Work Session meetings beginning at 6:00pm on the third Wednesday of each month.

Sweeping also saves water... hosing for 15 minutes uses about 150 gallons of water!



# NOTARY SERVICES AVAILABLE AT THE TOWNSHIP:

Notary services are now available at the Township Building, during normal business hours, from 8:00am to 4:30pm. The service is free for Worcester Township residents; a small fee is charged for non-residents.

# **AMANDA'S RECYCLING IDEAS**



Since pizza boxes are made from cardboard, you might think they are recyclable. Not necessarily. Cardboard that is soiled by grease and cheese is not recyclable.

When paper products are recycled they are mixed with water and turned into a slurry. Pizza box grease causes oil to form at the top of the slurry, and the oil attaches itself to the paper fibers, running the slurry batch.

Tear out the soiled portions of your pizza box before recycling. If the entire box is grease-free, the entire box can be recycled or composted. And you can be left to enjoy your pizza!

# BALANCED & SENSIBLE 2016 BUDGET ADOPTED

The 2016 Budget, adopted on December 16, maintains the quality services our residents have long enjoyed, and at a reasonable cost.

The budget holds the line on all taxes – rates for the per capita, earned income and property taxes will remain unchanged in 2016. In fact, Worcester's real estate tax rate ranks as the second lowest among Montgomery County's 67 municipalities.

The owner of a single-family property assessed at \$400,000 will pay \$20 in property taxes to the Township this year (note: the balance of property taxes are paid to the Methacton School District and Montgomery County).


Overall the budget assumes a modest 1.5% increase in operating revenues, and projects an approximate 4% decrease in operating expenditures.

The budget increases road resurfacing and other infrastructure repair dollars by about 10% — helping to keep our roadway network safe and in good condition. And the budget funds improvements in Heebner Park.

In addition, the budget provides strong financial support to the Worcester Township Fire Department. The Township will contribute \$200,000 in operating and capital contributions to our community's all-volunteer team of emergency responders.

# ROAD IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

This year Worcester Township will continue implementation of its annual road improvement program. This program is designed to maximize the useful life of infrastructure through an aggressive maintenance plan and appropriately-scheduled capital improvements. The program allows the Township to maintain more than 50 miles of roads in good condition.

The maintenance plan includes pothole repair, street sweeping, roadside brush trimming, roadside swale maintenance and patch milling.

The capital plan includes the replacement of culverts and storm water pipes and the

resurfacing and reconstruction of roads. On average, the Township resurfaces or reconstructs between two and four miles of roadways each year.

The number of roads treated depends on many factors, including the extent of repairs needed, the cost of materials and the damage done during the winter months. As such, road projects are often subject to change.

At this time projects proposed in 2016 include the repaying of:

- Hickory Hill Lane;
- Crest Terrace;
- Greenbriar Drive;
- Griffith Road;

- Fisher Road;
- Landis Road, from Potshop Road to Defford Road;
- Sunny Ayre Drive, from Locust to Warner;
- Windy Hill Road.

When the list of roads to be resurfaced is confirmed this information will be posted to the Township website.

Motorists using the above-noted roads may experience delays during construction. We thank folks for their understanding and patience as we work to improve our community's roadways.


- A <u>copy</u> of your contractor's PA license certificate is required with each permit application.

Municipalities require building permits to ensure proposed improvements meet building code standards. # FROM OUR NEIGHBORS NEXT DOOR Worcester Volunteer Fire Department

Thank you to all the residents that supported the Fire Department's 2015 fund drive, your donations helped our volunteers provide service 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

Below are several tips to help reduce delays when fire or EMS need to respond to an emergency:

- 1) ENSURE THAT YOUR HOUSE NUMBER IS VISI-BLE FROM THE STREET. Reflective letters or a reflective background makes the house number easier to find.
  - PLEASE REMEMBER TO CLEAR THE SNOW FROM AROUND THE FIRE HYDRANT NEAR YOUR HOME. During larger snow storms, the hydrants can be buried in snow from the plows and difficult to find.

3) **KEEP TREES AND BUSHES PRUNED ALONG YOUR DRIVEWAY.** The trucks are much higher and wider than your car (11 feet wide, and 14 feet tall). If you are planning gates at the end of the driveway, it is important to ensure trucks can enter, turn around, and exit.

Remember, for non emergency situations you can reach the Montgomery Dispatch center at 610-584-6911, they can page the duty fire officer at any time. It may take us several days to return phone calls at the Fire House.

The Fire Department is always looking for new members. The Department has a cadet program (ages 14 to 16), a junior fire fighter program aimed at high school age youth (ages 16 to 18) as well as regular membership.

Training is provided at both in-house training and courses at the Montgomery County Fire Academy at no cost to the members. If you are interested, stop by the firehouse on our Thursday drill night.
