### **SUNDAY, JULY 3RD, 10:30AM SANCTUARY SERVICE BACKPACK BUDDIES OFFERING**

On the first Sunday of every month at the 10:30am worship service, you are welcome to bring food items for the Community Kitchen Backpack Buddies program. Through this program, each Friday, approximately 250 children in need from local elementary schools are sent home with a backpack of food. Children are also provided food during Summer Break. These backpacks help meet basic weekend food needs of their families. A list of items is below. Please place the Backpack Buddies offering on the altar in worship on the first Sunday of every month, or you may leave your items during the week in the collection box in Garton Hall. This month you are also welcome to bring items on Sunday, July 10th.

#### Backpack Buddies Food List

- Individual fruit cups (applesauce, tropical fruit, pears, etc.)
- Instant Oatmeal (individual portions)
- Macaroni & Cheese
- Small boxes of cereal
- Easy-to-prepare food items (instant mashed potatoes, dried soups, beans, meal helpers, rice or pasta meals, etc.)
- Granola/fruit/cereal bars
- Dried fruit (raisins, cranberries, cherries, tropical fruit, etc.)
- Canned or pouch chicken or tuna
- Small bread mixes (cornbread, muffin, biscuit, etc.)

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## Celebrating “CALL”: Two Special Services in July

### SUNDAY, JULY 24TH

#### CELEBRATING THE CALL TO MINISTRY

JillAnn Meunier, a seminary student at Wesley Theological Seminary in Washington, DC, will preach the sermon. JillAnn was baptized at St. Mark's, and is taking Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) at Bloomington Hospital this summer. This is a Sunday in which we seek to enhance the “Culture of Call”—creating an environment in which members are encouraged to consider various forms of Christian Ministry as a life vocation.

There will also be a Mission Moment to invite contributions for the Reverend Chuck Myers Scholarship fund, which is designated to provide scholarship assistance for UMC seminary students. Chuck served churches in the South Indiana Conference, including St. Mark's, and also served as a district superintendent. Chuck saw pastoral care as his strongest asset. He also possessed a fine baritone singing voice which he loved to share by preaching “sermons in song.” Chuck's wife, Beth, continues to bless us at St. Mark's with her wisdom, faith, and kind and generous spirit.

### SUNDAY, JULY 31ST

#### CELEBRATING THE CALL OF ALL CHRISTIANS

This service will celebrate the calling all Christians have to serve God and others in the world. During worship, those attending will be invited to bring some symbol of their work or service in the world and to place their symbol in the chancel area. Breakfast that morning will be provided by retired UMC clergy and families, and all donations will go to the Chuck Myers Scholarship Fund.

### **BIBLE BANTER**

The Bible Banter class uses the Scripture text for the morning's sermon as a discussion-starter. We look at the passage in its larger context, and sometimes explore a bit of Bible-writing history. We offer some thoughts on what the morning's sermon might look like, based on the Scripture the pastor has selected. We leave time to discuss implications of the Scripture for our own lives, and often even delve into topics far afield of the morning's original topic. You are invited to bring some coffee/breakfast from Garton Hall into Room 11 and join the conversation.

### **NOMADS**

In July, the Nomads class will continue discussion of Anne Lamott's 2013 book, *Stitches: A Handbook on Meaning, Hope and Repair*. All are welcome to join us (even without reading the book!).

### **PILGRIMS**

On Sundays in July, the Pilgrims class will study the Old Testament using video lectures from Amy-Jill Levine of Vanderbilt University Divinity School. The goal of the series is to provide members of faith communities with richer insights into the literature that forms their bedrock. Each week, discussion follows the video. All are welcome.
