Her main research interests are: social innovation, leadership development, multiple intelligences, appreciative inquiry and sustainable leadership.

Fredrik shared these thoughts when he joined the PRME WG on Sustainability Mindset: "A lot of the discussion on sustainability tends to see it as more or less a technical or organizational question. From my perspective we need to bring people – our values and mindsets – forward in the process towards sustainability. In addition to the perspectives of economic, ecological and social sustainability – we also need to look at sustainability mindset(s).

What is clear about sustainability, and what is also highlighted in the SDGs, is that sustainability is 'global' – at the same time embedded in local social-ecological ecosystems as well as in global networks. A key to understanding and developing sustainable mindsets is, I think, to integrate these perspectives more in the Academy. In order to do this – and to learn from each other's

Marsha Willard, Ph.D. teaches graduate classes on sustainability for Pinchot University, University of Oregon and the Presidio Graduate School as well as serving on the faculty for the International Society Professionals. She is founder, first executive director and currently a board officer of the International Society of Sustainability Professionals, the first professional association for people working in the field of sustainability.

Marsha is an independent consultant, author and teacher with over 25 years' experience working with organizations to help them operate more sustainably. She is the co-author of The Business Guide to Sustainability (winner of the 2007 American Library Association Award for best academic titles, the third edition was released in 2015) and The Step by Step Guide to Sustainability Planning.

Marsha has also designed a number of sustainability related tools including the Sustainability Planning and Reporting Kit (SPaRK™), a set of electronic files that help organizations develop a plan and track the various metrics (e.g., recycling rate, greenhouse gases, living wage, water use, etc.), the Sustainability Overlay, a product developed through a grant from the Lemelson Foundation to be used to augment the Business Model Generation Canvas, and S-CORE, a sustainability assessment tool now administered through ISSP.

She is looking forwards to connecting to peers around the world and sharing resources and ideas for innovation through the PRME WG on Sustainability Mindset.
