English before being selected to become a Navy pilot.

She earned her Wings of Gold in 2007, and in 2008 completed two combat deployments. She earned three Air Medals in recognition of her combat flights over Afghanistan. In 2011, Stephanie was selected to attend Navy Fighter Weapons School (TOPGUN) at Naval Air Station Fallon in Fallon, Nevada. Upon graduation, Stephanie became only the 5th single seat female fighter pilot to complete the demanding course. Stephanie was deployed in 2014 for combat missions over both Iraq and Syria, earning

her fourth Air Medal. In total, Stephanie has accrued over 1450 hours in tactical aircraft, 304 carrier arrested landings, and has executed 77 combat sorties.




