National Jamborees are one of BSA's coolest traditions. They've been around since 1937, and they just get better and better every four years. Jamborees are a place to make new friends, to experience adrenaline-raising activities, to attend high-energy stadium shows, to trade patches with Scouts from across the country, to explore the stunning high-adventure playground called the Summit Bechtel Reserve and to unite with tens of thousands of fellow Scouts and Scouters.

Registration for the 2017 National Jamboree registration is now open, so make sure to reserve your spot now before the contingent fills up. We only have spots for 36 Scouts and 4 leaders.

Most Boy Scouts, Varsity Scouts, Venturers and adult leaders are eligible to experience the unforgettable excitement of the 2017 National Jamboree.

For Scouts:

- Scouts must be a First Class Scout and at least 12 years old by the first day of the Jamboree (July 19, 2017) or an 11year old who has graduated the sixth grade.
- A Scout born on or before July 19, 2005, will be 12 by jamboree time.
- There's an upper limit, too. To be a Boy Scout participant, you can't have reached your 18th birthday by the last day of the Jamboree (July 28, 2017).

For Leaders (Applications are due by OCTOBER 31, 2015)

- All Jamboree Scoutmasters, First, Second and Third Assistant Scoutmasters must meet the following requirements:
 - Have a current BSA membership with a Boy Scout troop or Varsity team.
 - Be approved by the local council.
 - Complete Youth Protection Training within one year of the last day of the Jamboree.
 - Meet the medical and BMI requirements of the Jamboree.
 - Participate and assist in planning the pre-Jamboree training experience with their local council.
 - All leaders must file a BSA Health & Medical Record with their council within one year of attending the Jamboree. (The council will provide specifics closer to the Jamboree.)
- Scoutmasters and First Assistant Scoutmasters must be at least 21 years of age by the first day of the Jamboree.
- Second Assistant Scoutmasters must be at least 18 years of age by the first day of the Jamboree.
- Third Assistant Scoutmasters must be at least 18 years of age by the first day of the Jamboree but not yet 21 years of age by the last day of the Jamboree.
- Scoutmaster applicants must be currently serving as a Scoutmaster or Varsity Scout Coach.
- First, Second or Third Assistant Scoutmasters must currently be serving in any adult troop or team leadership position.
- Scoutmaster applicants must have completed Scoutmaster or Varsity Scout Couch leader specific training.
