Tuesday, May 3 - Krakow: On arrival in Krakow you will be greeted by your tour manager and directed to your waiting motor coach. After check-in at the hotel, the remainder of the day will be at leisure. Dinner and overnight in Krakow. (D)

Wednesday, May 4 – Krakow: For five hundred years Krakow was the seat of the Polish kings. Miraculously unscathed during World War II and now on the UNESCO list of World Heritage Sites, it is certainly one of Europe's most charming cities. This morning's own sightseeing or shop for Polish handicrafts at the Cloth Hall. we will continue to Wittenberg for dinner and overnight. (B,D) Overnight in Krakow. (B)

we will drive to Auschwitz, site of the notorious Nazi concentration camp. After a haunting visit to the death camp, we will enjoy our excursion to the Wieliczka Salt Mines. Listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site, the Salt Mines are a unique phenomenon, once described as being as remarkable as the Pyramids, but more useful. Each of the chambers is more spectacular than the one before incredible to imagine that the gnomes, the chandeliers, the altars are all carved from salt. Overnight in Krakow. (B)

Friday, May 6 – Krakow / Prague: This morning, we say good-bye to Poland and motor into the Czech Republic. We pass towns rich in Gothic, Renaissance and Baroque styles, and villages splashed with warmly painted, timber homes. In the early evening, we arrive in Prague for the next two nights. (B,D)

Saturday, May 7 – Prague: Known as the Golden City, the city of one hundred-towers and the Jerusalem of Europe, Prague is one of Europe's most beautiful cities. It is also justifiably considered to be one of the forerunners of the Reformation, when Jan Hus, Rector of the university preached against the sale of indulgences one hundred years before Martin Luther. Today's walking tour will take in all the highlights of this breath-taking city - the castle the Charles' Bridge and the Old Town Square. The afternoon and evening are free for individual exploration. (B)

Sunday, May 8 – Prague / Dresden / Erfurt: This morning we drive through the Erzgebirge to the German border and on to Dresden. Once called Florence on the Elbe, for its unique collection of artistic treasures, palaces and museums, the city was razed to the ground during World War II. Dresden has risen from the ashes and with the rebuilding of the Frauenkirche, has become the symbol of a Germany at peace with itself and its neighbors. Following our walking tour to see the Semper Opera House, the Zwinger royal residence, the Court Church and the Meissen porcelain Procession of Princes, there will be time for lunch and individual sightseeing, before we continue to Erfurt for dinner and overnight. (B,D)

we will drive through the rolling hills of Thuringia to Eisenach, where Martin Luther attended school and sang as a choirboy. Our journey will continue up the mountain overlooking the town to the Wartburg, one of Germany's most ancient castles. It was here that journey home. Arrive Ft. Myers this afternoon. Luther lived in hiding as Junker Jörg for 10 months following the decree which declared him an outlaw after the Diet of Worms in 1521. During this time he translated the New Testament from the

Monday, May 2, 2016 - Ft. Myers: Today we depart from Ft. original Greek text into German. Following our visit of the castle we will return to Erfurt, which is one of Germany's oldest towns, with 1250 years of history and a skyline dominated by the spires of its Cathedral and St. Severi Church. Our walking tour of the city will include the 600 year old Kraemer Bridge, the Collegium Maius where Luther attended the university and the remains of the Augustinian Monastery, where he began his monastic life. The remainder of the afternoon and evening are free for individual sightseeing. (B)

Tuesday, May 10 – Erfurt / Leipzig / Wittenberg: This morning we will depart Erfurt and drive to Leipzig, where our walking tour will walking tour will visit the area of Wawel Castle and its Cathedral include St. Thomas Church and the tomb of Johann Sebastian Bach, before dropping down into the old town to see the Market St. Nicholas Church where the Monday Demonstrations played such Square, Cloth Hall and St. Mary's Church with its magnificent a leading role in the downfall of the Communist regime in 1989 and high altar by Veit Stoss. The afternoon is free to continue your the famous Gewandhaus Concert Hall. Following free time for lunch,

Wednesday, May 11 - Wittenberg: Today is the climax of our Thursday, May 5 - Krakow / Auschwitz / Salt Mines: This morning journey in the footsteps of Martin Luther, in the city which is regarded as the very Cradle of the Reformation, where he lived and worked from 1508 to 1546. Our walking tour of Wittenberg will include the Luther House, formerly the Augustinian Monastery, later home of the Luthers and now the largest museum dedicated to the Reformation in the world. We will continue to the Town Church, where Luther preached and the Castle Church, where he posted his 95 theses and where both he and Melanchthon are buried. The remainder of the afternoon and evening is at leisure to truly enjoy Wittenberg - perhaps visit the newly restored Melanchthon House or the House of History, a fascinating documentation of everyday life in the Communist era of East Germany. Overnight in Wittenberg. (B)

Thursday, May 12 – Wittenberg / Potsdam / Berlin: This morning we will drive to Potsdam, favorite residence of the Prussian Kings and German Emperors. Our tour will include a visit to Cecilienhof Palace, which hosted the Potsdam Peace Conference in the summer of 1945 and the gardens of Sans Souci, the Rococo residence of Frederick the Great. Following free time for lunch, we will continue to Berlin, where in the elegant suburbs of the city, we will visit the home of Dietrich Bonhoeffer, Lutheran pastor, theologian and martyr. As a founding member of the Confessing Church, he was an outspoken opponent of the Nazi regime and one of the few voices area of Hradcany with St. Vitus Cathedral, the Lesser Quarter, raised against the persecution of the Jews. His involvement in plans to assassinate Hitler led to his arrest in 1943 and execution in April 1945, just 23 days before Germany's unconditional surrender. In the early evening, we will check into our Berlin hotel. (B)

Friday, May 13 – Berlin: This morning our city tour will explore the sometimes tortured history of this fascinating city. Re-instated as Germany's capital and seat of government after re-unification in 1990, there are still 3 parts to this city – old East Berlin, old West Berlin and the 'new' Berlin which has grown out of the wasteland of 'noman's land' around the Wall. We will experience many reminders of Berlin's recent tragic past - the remains of the Berlin Wall, the place where Checkpoint Charlie once stood, the new Jewish Memorial but also the elegant avenue Unter den Linden, the Brandenburg Gate, once symbol of the divided city, the Cathedral, Reichstag and the beautiful symmetry of Gendarmenmarkt. The early afternoon Monday, May 9 – Erfurt (Wartburg Excursion): Following breakfast is free for individual sightseeing before we gather for our farewell dinner. (B,SD)

Saturday, May 14 – Berlin / Ft. Myers: This morning we begin our

CANCELLATIONS per person: All cancellations must be in writing and acknowledged by TWT.
