DID YOU KNOW?


In this week's gospel,

Boredom Busters!

Materials:

- 2 small baby food jars
- Water
- Red and blue food colouring
- 4" x 4" piece of cardboard

Directions:

- Fill one jar with hot water, and the other jar with cold water
- Add a few drops of blue food colouring to cold water
- Add a few drops of red food colouring to hot water
- Place the square of cardboard over the top of the red water jar
- Carefully invert the jar onto the top of the blue water jar
- Pull the cardboard out

The water from the jars will not mix together! (Except for a tiny amount in the very center.) Is this a miracle? No! It's actually science—the two colours do not mix because of the difference in water temperature. The hot water stays on top.
