DID YOU KNOW?

The entire first half of the "Hail Mary" prayer is taken from the first chapter of Luke. Check in your Bible and see! (note: some bibles have different wordings so it might not be exactly the same)

"Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you" (Lk. 1:28) is what the angel Gabriel says to Mary when he tells her she will become the mother of Jesus.

"Blessed are you among women and blessed is the fruit of your womb, Jesus" (Lk. 1:42) is what Elizabeth says to Mary during their encounter.

Characters:

- Shopper #1/wife/Sunday school teacher

(Remember: one person can play multiple characters)

- Shopper #2/husband/Sunday school child

- Priest

Shopper #1: (sounding exhausted) This is a busy time of year! I have to shop and bake and decorate and get ready for all the parties!

Shopper #2: (Nodding her head) I know what you mean. I haven't even started addressing our Christmas cards yet.

Shopper #1: Cards?! Oh no. I knew I'd forget something. Hey, I've got to run to the store right now! (She hurriedly turns around and exits)

(4 students, sitting beside each other on stools)

Sam: People sure are busy these days.

Mollie: Yeah. Mom and Dad hardly have time to rest

Garrett: Is that what Christmas is all about... being busy?

Jason: Let's see if we can find out what Christmas is all about. Here comes someone now! (a husband and wife enter. Husband is carrying packages, and wife is checking things off a long list)

Mollie: (gets off her stool and walks toward the couple) Excuse me. May I ask you a question? Wife: Huh? Oh! What? Excuse me, little girl. (To her husband) Isn't she cute? (To Mollie) We don't have time to talk right now. (Looks at her list and literally turns her husband around to return to a store. She calls over her shoulder to Mollie) Sorry! We're just too busy. (To her husband) Isn't she cute? (They exit)

Sam: We didn't find anything out from those shoppers.

Mollie: They were too busy

Garrett: I want to know the true meaning of Christmas.

Jason: Me too!

Sam: Here comes someone else. (woman with lots of groceries enters from the office) Maybe she can answer our question. Excuse me, are you busy?

Grocery Shopper: (sighing, carrying grocery bag with script taped on the back of it) I certainly am busy. I was baking cookies, and I ran out of vanilla. I was so sure that I had plenty of vanilla. Isn't that the way it always is. The ingredient you're sure you have is the first to go. Oh yes, I'm very busy! These cookies are for church, you know. (She pauses and thinks) But do you want a cookie? I do have a few from my first batch with me. (She hands them a cookie and exits)

Mollie: Well, what did she say? Sam: She was too busy to talk

Garrett: Do you ever think we'll find the true meaning of Christmas?

Jason: Everyone's too busy! I'm frustrated.

Priest: Hi kids! How is everything going?

Mollie: Not too well

Garrett: I'm frus-ter-ated!

Jason: Everyone is too busy to tell us the true meaning of Christmas. We know all the regular stuff like shopping and cookies and cards, but what is the real meaning of Christmas?

 $\textbf{Priest:} \ \ \textbf{Well it is a busy time of year, but I think I've got time to talk to all of you. Here, let me get my Bible. It's all in God's Word \\$

(He reads Luke 2:1-14 from the Bible and someone brings out a nativity set). God sent His Son to earth at Christmas. Jesus lived on this earth for 33 years, and then was crucified. Jesus never did anything wrong. He didn't die for HIS sins, He died for our sins so that we could spend eternity in heaven with God.

So the busyness and fun is a part of the celebration of Christmas. We just have to be careful that being busy doesn't replace being with Christ. Jesus is what it is all about. He is the true meaning of Christmas.
