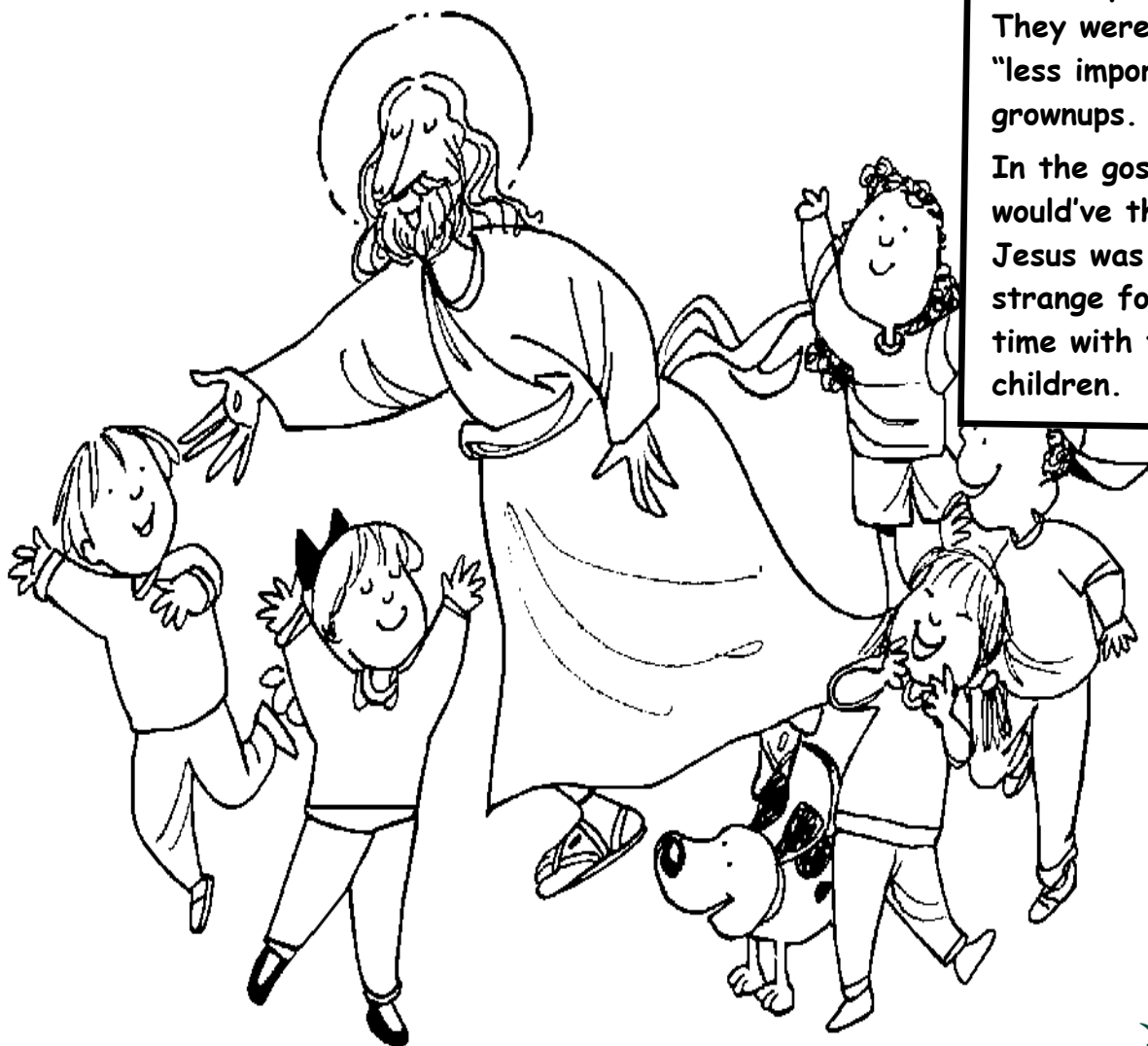
#### DID YOU KNOW?
