Jesus got into the boat that belonged to Simon and he said to him, "Row the boat out where the water is deep. Put your nets into the water, and you will catch some fish."


Simon said, "Master, we fished all night long and didn't catch anything! But if you say so, we will try again now."

They brought their boats onto the shore and left everything to follow Jesus.






# What do YOU Think About this Story?

# **Boredom Busters!**

Today's gospel shows Jesus providing for His disciples. He doesn't just provide them with the bare minimum, He provides them with way more than they need! There were so many fish that their nets were breaking!

Although February is too cold to go fishing, we can still celebrate Jesus' generosity with a fish feast!

#### A Fishy Recipe

#### **Ingredients**

- 1 lb. fish fillets or steaks
- 1 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/4 c. milk
- 1/2 c. dry bread crumbs
- 2 Tbsp. margarine/butter, melted

#### Directions

- 1. If fish fillets are large, cut them into pieces to serve five
- 2. Stir salt into milk
- 3. Dip fish into milk, then coat with breadcrumbs
- 4. Place in a well-greased 9x13 pan. Pour melted butter over fish
- 5. Place pan on rack, slightly above the middle of the oven. Cook uncovered at 500-degrees until fish flakes easily with fork, 10-12 minutes. Makes 5 servings.
