# DID YOU KNOW?

Jesus is often call the Messiah, which means "anointed one".

Long before Jesus was born, the Jewish people were always bullied by other countries (the Egyptians, the Babylonians, the Romans). God had promised them a "Messiah" to one day set them free. The Jews thought God meant freedom from these countries' persecution", but God actually meant "freedom from our sin".

In today's gospel, the Jews got mixed up and thought John the Baptist was this Messiah.
