Even though Jesus was fully God, He was also fully human. He's not half-God and half-human, He's actually 100% God and 100% human. This is a mystery that we won't understand until we're in Heaven!

We hear about Jesus'
God-ness (His 'divinity') so much
that sometimes we forget about
His human side. Just like you and
me, Jesus would have had friends,
played games, laughed at jokes,
cried when he skinned His knee,
and prayed at nighttime with His
parents (Mary and Joseph).

This week's gospel story shows His humanity and His divinity. Just like you and I, He was celebrating at a friend's wedding and he maybe even danced! But we also see His divinity when he transforms the water into wine to keep the celebration going!

One day there was a wedding at Cana... Jn. 2:1-12

...and Mary the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and His disciples were also invited to the wedding. Now when Jesus' mother saw that there wasn't any wine left, she said to him, "They don't have any more wine."

Jesus said, "Why are you telling me about this? It is not time for people to know who I am."

Then Jesus' mother said to those who were serving at the celebration, "Do whatever Jesus tells you."

Now there were six large water jugs there, and each other them held about twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to the servers, "Fill those jugs with water." After the servers filled the jugs, Jesus said, "Now take some of it to the waiter in charge of the celebration."

The waiter did not see what happened so when he tasted the water which Jesus had turned into wine, he called the bridegroom over and said to him, "People usually serve the very best wine first. Then after the guests have been drinking for a long time, they serve the cheaper wine. But you have saved the best wine until now!"

And so, the first miracle that Jesus did was at Cana in Galilee. With this sign, Jesus revealed His glory, and His disciples believed in Him.
