Occupational Accident - Addressing a coverage gap when an owner operator gets hurt on the job

The trucking industry depends on over 350,000 owner operators to meet growth demands. Owner operators are not employees and are typically excluded from a workers' compensation policy. An owner operators on the job injury may leave both the injured driver and the trucking company without needed financial protection.

Ohio rolls out "Other States" workers' compensation coverage

Issue: Historically, the Ohio BWC only paid workers' comp. benefits payable for Ohio claims. If an employee files a workers' comp. claim in a state other than Ohio and the other state accepts jurisdiction, the employer could:

- 1. Be stuck paying benefits
- 2. Be in violation of the workers comp. laws of the state accepting jurisdiction and subject to fines.

In order to fill this potential coverage gap, employers secured "Other States" coverage through the insurance market, of which there are limited options.

Solution: As of Mar, 1, 2016, the Ohio BWC began providing Other States Coverage (OSC) polices for Ohio employers. Employers can apply directly to BWC for this coverage or have an agent such as National Risk Management help secure the coverage for your company. Call us if you would like our support.
