Why are Qualified Interpreters necessary?

Sign Language interpreters are highly experience professionals that have specialized expertise and training. While proficiency in English and in Sign Language is necessary, language skills alone are not sufficient for an individual to work as a professional interpreter. Becoming an interpreter is a complex process that requires a high degree of linguistic and technical skills. According to ADA Regulations, a qualified interpreter is required to be able to interpret accurately, both expressively and receptively using any specialized vocabulary needed for the communication. While professional certification is not required under the law, an important measure of an interpreter's proven ability is professional credentials by an accrediting organization such as Registry of Interpreters for the Deaf, Inc. (RID)
