Well, we survived the revival! It was truly amazing wasn't it? Did you feel the Holy Spirit working through the music of Fran McKendree and the preaching of Fr. David Canan and Fr. Jeffrey Ross? That was some good preaching and singing! Are you as totally renewed and invigorated by the whole thing as I am?

September has been the time to RECONNECT. You have had a chance to do so via the cottage meetings and hopefully you participated in Rally Day, where you signed up and joined new ministries that interest you and are ready to do God's work.

We are now ready for the next step in the Saints Coming Alive movement: RECOMMIT.

You know, of course, that all of the ministries associated with Rally Day are part of the overall stewardship program at All Saints'. We make a pledge to be present and to serve and volunteer our time to these ministries. God's ministries can only grow with your help and presence. Another part of the committal process is our pledge of monetary gifts to the church to fund all of our ministries.

This year the theme for the fall stewardship campaign is "Grounded in Gratitude, Revealed in Prayer, Lived in Faith". Our focus is on the gratitude we show to God for all the gifts he has provided for us. One way this spirit of gratitude is revealed is via prayer. As we pray and become closer to God, our lives, in turn, are lived through faith.

All that we are and all that we have comes from God. This understanding is part of our tradition and part of our weekly worship. God calls us to another standard and that is to return to God for God's work, a portion of what we have been given.

The standard of giving is the tithe which is 10%. The Vestry of All Saints' recognizes this and all the members are working towards the tithe in their own personal giving. Please join the Vestry in making a pledge and working towards the tithe.

The fall stewardship campaign starts the Sunday after our Fall BBQ, October 7<sup>th,</sup> and concludes with a visit from Bishop George Young on October 28<sup>th</sup>. Each Sunday in October there will be special sermons, teachings, prayer groups and displays on Gratitude, Prayer and Faith. There will be something for everyone in which to participate.

You need not worry about keeping up with a pledge card this year; no pledge cards will be mailed before the campaign. The cards will be handed out on the day the Bishop is present and there will be time to reflect, pray, and fill them out and then carry them to the altar for blessing.

Please make plans to attend all of the Sundays in October and especially on the Sunday that the Bishop visits.

### REGARDING ANNOUNCEMENTS DURING SUNDAY WORSHIP

The Worship Committee met in August and in September. On the agenda at both meetings were announcements during Sunday worship. It was a lively discussion and included much conversation about <a href="https://www.when.com/when.co

At issue is that sometimes the number of announcements and announcement length gets out of hand. Often the request to make an announcement comes just before the opening procession and the announcement is made "on the fly."

It is the sense of the Worship Committee that giving some thought to what needs to be announced and the best way to do that will make our announcements — both written and verbal–more timely and more available to all.

So, please note the instructions below. We begin on the First Sunday of Advent, Dec. 9.

- If you wish to make an announcement, consider that those who will need the information may not be in attendance on a Sunday and consider making the announcement in writing as well as verbally.
- Written announcements can be submitted to Lynne Ann by 9am on Tuesday of the week preceding the Sunday you wish to make a verbal announcement. The deadline for newsletter items is the 15th of the month preceding the event. This insures publication in the newsletter, in the service bulletin AND in the Friday email. This expands the number of people who receive the news.
- If you wish to make a verbal announcement during Sunday worship, please contact the Rector and/or Lynne Ann by phone or email no later than 12N on the Thursday preceding the day you wish to make the announcement.
- We will try to accommodate those who wish to speak. Our preference is to limit announcements to no more than two speakers per service. Exceptions are possible; but we need to know well in advance.
- Verbal announcements will be made on a first come, first served basis.

Thank you for your cooperation. We hope these steps will actually help remind us all of the various ways in which communication can happen.





#### GROWING ALL SAINTS EPISCOPAL SCHOOL: An Evening of Inspiration

A gathering of highly engaged ASES community members witnessed the "heart" of the school in a convivial evening at the Country Club on September 13, which exceeded expectations. In the first full report of the Long Range Planning Committee, LRPC co-chairs Anne Sheedlo and Renee Siddiqi spoke to the emotional ties that bind them to the school. They selflessly commit countless hours of volunteer work in order to achieve the goal of making All Saints the best that it can be.

The pair described the focused tasks of the LRPC through the work of various sub-committees that effected computer upgrades, increased playground safety, sealed & striped the parking lot, improved marketing, conducted grant research. Efforts to advertise our accreditation grow our endowment and market ASES to surrounding counties have all been a direct result of the LRPC. Additionally, we have upgraded our benchmarks, are currently in the process of adding a classroom pilot technology program, and establishing an in-house lunch program.

#### Seven Reasons...

Highlights of the school's program and some of our shared values were disseminated at the "Growing All Saints" event in the form of "Seven Reasons Your Child Belongs."

- Student Safety: A closely knit community that follows both national guidelines for safety and the detailed child safety training of the Episcopal Church, ASES is the safest place for your child to learn and grow.
- Caring Faculty: The average teaching tenure of the ASES faculty member is 25 years. We believe that such
  longevity is founded in a deep, abiding love and respect for children. Our teachers give more than the
  "allotted" time for preparation, go out of their way to keep parents informed, and demonstrate a real
  understanding of their students' learning styles.
- Christian Environment: Our core values, Spirituality, Tolerance, Achievement, Integrity, Respect, and Service, are grounded in Judeo-Christian tradition. Religion class is taught at every grade level and Chapel services are held weekly.
- Low Ratios: K-8th grade teacher-student ratio is 1 to 12. In the Early Learning Center it's 1 to 7.
- High Expectations: Accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools and the Southern Association of Independent Schools, ASES has been thoroughly vetted by two of the country's most rigorous academic agencies. Recent curricular changes include the adaptation of the Massachusetts Curriculum benchmarks...some of the highest in the country.
- Full Enrichment: Formal Art classes, Spanish Language classes, Physical Education classes, Music classes and Technology classes are part of our fully enriched curriculum. Extra-curricular clubs, groups and sports are always growing and include the Chess Club, the Yearbook Club, our competitive interscholastic sports teams, the Junior Basketball program, and Singing Saints.
- Field Studies: Distinguishing the difference between field studies and field trips, ASES students experience both. Whether it's a visit from the fire department for our youngest or a week-long study of the Florida Everglades for our eldest, all trips are academic in nature.

The annual grant is provided to those organizations that meet the criteria and send in the best applications. #### **THE EARLY LEARNING CENTER**

Our youngest students continue to thrive. Here's snapshot of typical activities in the ELC.



The 2's are counting: how many apple slices, how many apple seeds? Daily they are seen dancing around the room closely following the directions of their teachers

Stop by the 3's room and you will find the children making clay letters and writing on slate boards with wet sponges. The 3's are looking at different sizes and deciding if circles are big, bigger, biggest or small, smaller, smallest. Help them to continue comparing by using describing words.

Stop by the 4's room and see the 4's using pencils to make diagonal lines, open curves, and closed curves. The 4's will tell you they are making mountains, U's, circles, slanted lines left-to-right and slanted lines right-to-left. The 4's have started the first unit, "What's the Shape", in their new math program. They are finding shapes EVE-RYWHERE!

A new program started by art teacher Dot Nosal has all ages participating in craft activities on Wednesdays after school. First, the Wednesday crew learned to knit scarves up next quilting – good stuff!


