Your church needs your increased support in order to adequately provide for your new clergy person, as well as the sustaining the programs of the parish.

will be receiving your stewardship letter and your pledge card in the next few weeks. Please complete the card and bring it with you to worship on All Saints' Sunday, November 3rd.





September saw the conclusion of the first six weeks grading period for students at All Saints'. And with the end of the grading period comes the highly anticipated (rarely dreaded) report card. This time, students and parents got to see their report card issued through our new School Management Software, RenWeb. The implementation of this new software has been rocky but rewarding. Perhaps the most utilized feature by parents as a whole, online lunch ordering has greatly streamlined not only the parents' ability to place lunch orders but also the school's ability to track daily order totals for each class. ASEC members and ASES teachers, Holley Dickens and Susie Justice have lead the charge for faculty usage of RenWeb and are to be commended. Staff members Treasure Phillips and Charlotte Holland are the innovators, always discovering the next great feature available to us and how we can best implement it.

Middle school students spent the night at Grace Point Camp for their "Inward Bound" retreat. This trip, replacing the overnight previously held at Camp Wesley Woods, was a success by all accounts. After meeting with camp director, Rev. Brad Jones, and visiting the camp on a church related trip this past summer, Dr. Selby was convinced that it was the right time to refocus the fall overnight experience. Grace Point counselors led the ASES students in a variety of outdoor activities including archery, hiking and fishing. The faculty and staff who interact daily with our middle school students were tasked with adding a spiritual, self-examination element to the trip. In particular, the students were given a chance to reflect upon their position in the school—as role models for the younger students and leaders in the Core Values program. The results of this retreat have not only helped set the tone for the weekly religion class in the middle school, but have also added a dimension to our Wednesday chapel services. The eighth graders in particular seem conscious of their behavior-as-example, and we trust that the lessons they learned on retreat will remain with them as they begin to catch the "I'm-Ready-For-High-School" flu.

School is for the birds! The fourth grade class kicked off the fall migratory season by filling up bird feeders in the center courtyard. Two birds that have come to stay are busy nesting in the Science Lab. Zebra finches, Cosmo and Wanda, seem to be quite comfortable listening in on the learning. The Lady Eagles volleyball team (including church youth, Celeste Sexton) is in the middle of a challenging season. Facing teams much taller (and occasionally older) than they, the girls play fearlessly and never let their spirits fail. When all is said and done, the numbers may not show a winning season, but the parents and supporters know that when a team plays with *heart* no one loses.

The Parent-Teacher-Student Organization (PTSO) will once again join the BBQ faithful on October 11th. Have a sweet tooth? Be sure to introduce yourself to our parents as you find the perfect tidbit to compliment the pork!



Vestry Elections Ahead

Hello! Yes, I'm talking to you. Have you ever thought about serving on the vestry? Do you have an interest in serving your church? We will be having elections again at the beginning of the year and this is the time when the nominating committee is preparing a slate of nominees.

The qualifications for service are: must be a communicant in good standing.

A communicant means one must be a member of the parish by virtue of Baptism, Confirmation or by transfer by letter from another Episcopal or Lutheran church or by Reception by the Bishop and who has received Holy Communion at least three times during the preceding year.

In good standing indicates additional faithfulness in regular attendance, working and praying for the spread of the Kingdom of God and by providing financial support of the church through pledging.
