

#### Dear Friends,

As I write this, Ken and I are still on vacation. The past ten days have been emotionally full and over-flowing as we visit with friends and family. With each interaction I am reminded of how important "connection" is when it comes to nurturing and maintaining any relationship.

First we spent four days in Montana, just outside of Glacier Park, with the priest who mentored me on my journey to the priesthood, and the friend who provided considerable financial support for me to go to seminary. How grateful I am that God works through people whose generous spirit can significantly impact others. Without their confidence in me, and their emotional and financial support, going to seminary would have been both improbable and unlikely.

Then we flew to the beautiful Black Hills of South Dakota for a family reunion with my brother, sister, cousins, their spouses, children and grandchildren. We all descend from the Brownson Family who left the farmlands of New York to settle in Dakota Territory in 1864; as well as Jen Julius Hvistendahl who came from Denmark in the same year to stake his claim on the free land. As we gathered as family, recalling memories, telling stories, and sharing our own journeys, it was easy to see the strengths and qualities of those early settlers evident in each of us some 150 years later.

As I write this, we are in Minnesota, spending time with our children and grandchildren. What a joy it is to be greeted by three smiling children, all proudly wearing their Tennessee T-shirts! I, on the other hand, am now sporting a necklace made with neon-colored beads made just for me! Ken and I will be busy these three days playing animal sequence, scrabble, puzzles, and maybe even something new.

On Thursday I will have lunch with a college friend whose husband died last year. There is something irreplaceable about maintaining a connection with someone who knew you when you were seventeen years old, and who has journeyed with you through all the changes and chances that life offers.

We each have a human need to feel connected to one another. In the hustle and bustle of life it is so easy to ignore this need. So often we are too busy to send that card, to have that promised lunch, to pick up the phone, or to go to that funeral. But it is in those things that a relationship is nurtured.

The same is true with our relationship with God. Sunday mornings can beckon us to things other than worshiping God. But even if we go to church, we can easily fail to connect with God through prayer and reflection, as we go through life the other days of the week.

All of this requires each of us to be intentional about developing and fostering meaningful connections with God and each other. It is especially true in our outreach, as we strive to meet the needs of those who need our help. We can donate food, write a check, and pack bags of food, but the greatest gift we can give to people is to show them first hand our Christian love for them. As the song goes, "They will know that we are Christians by our love."

Outreach will continue the Christmas project of providing pajamas for the children at Food on Foot. These children look forward to receiving new pajamas for Christmas. Also, we hope to again sponsor a "Coats for the Cold" drive in order to provide warm jackets for the children served by Central Services.

We encourage your continued support of the programs instituted by ALPS throughout the year. Morristown is fortunate to have this wonderful organization in town.

Since it was so very successful, we also have a long-term goal of sending children from Hamblen County to Camp

Billy Johnson again next summer. Fifteen children, including one of our own, attended this camp and had a wonderful Christian camp experience.

This course will be led by Deacons Gigi and Jim Sharp, who will have just returned from a conference featuring Bishop Curry, and if you have seen any of the videos of his sermons from General Convention, you know that this man is on fire for Jesus! You just can't help but be moved by this man's energy and passion.

- Beginning in September, Mother Brown will lead a weekly Bible Study on Wednesday mornings at 10:00.
- Beginning on September 13, Project Canterbury will continue its Bible Study on Sunday nights at 5:30 p.m. with a light dinner. Any young adult from the ages of 17 to 30 is welcomed to join us and to bring a friend. We will continue with viewing the Rob Bell "Nooma" series of DVDs, Bible reading and discussion.

  "official" members of the All Saints' parish, will begin in the Spring. Bishop Young is making his annual visit in June, so that


