

From the 2013 Vestry Retreat

The weather forecast was for snow showers. The lake at Watts Bar was choppy and the sky was overcast when the Vestry of All Saints' arrived at Grace Point Retreat House for the annual retreat. Among the group were the four, newly elected Vestry persons.

After taking a few minutes to unload cars and stretch, the group gathered around and spent a few minutes getting to know one another. Then Pastor Scherry identified the three foci of the retreat: 1) Canon Stephen Askew was on hand to outline the process that churches in the Diocese of East Tennessee follow when transitioning from one Rector to another. 2) the Vestry would explore what does it mean to be a parish leader and 3) time would be spent on insuring ongoing continuity in doing the business of the church.

"You have probably already had people come up to you and tell that they were willing to serve on a search committee. Or they have made recommendations to you," Canon Askew said. And everyone laughed. "You are not there, yet," he responded. "There are some steps you will take before ever getting to the issues that seem to be at the forefront of people's minds: who is on the Search Committee? who is the Interim? how quickly will we get a new Rector? The Vestry then spent two hours in exchange with Canon Askew. The result is the unanimous decision that Canon Askew should speak to the entire parish about this process. He will do so during the Adult Class time on February 24th.

"What kind of community are we called to build?" "What do we look like organizationally? "How do we function?" "What issues face us?" These reflections were incorporated into some Vestry exercises and discussion for the afternoon and early evening at Grace Point. "I love this," said Maudie Briggs. "There is a lot to know. It's a little overwhelming," said both Ginger Goolsby and Brooke White, newly elected members of the Vestry. "I am glad that there are already some people in place," said Sarah Gose.

Outside, snow covered the deck overlooking the lake and a male cardinal was fighting his reflection in the window. Inside, a new Vestry was forming as it does every year.

The 29th Annual Diocesan Convention, will be held February 8-9, 2013, at the Marriot Hotel, with closing Eucharist at St. John's Cathedral on Saturday.

This statement of the Mission of Christ was developed by the Anglican Consultative Council between 1984 and 1990. It has given parishes and dioceses around the world a practical and memorable "checklist" for mission activities. These Five Marks of Mission are grounded in the promises of the Baptismal Covenant and are the "strategies" for fulfilling what our Prayer Book names as the mission of the church: to reconcile the world to God in Christ.

The Five Marks of Mission are:

- ~ To proclaim the Good News of the Kingdom
- ~ To teach, baptize and nurture new believers
- ~ To respond to human need by loving service
- ~ To seek to transform unjust societal structures
- ~ To strive to safeguard the integrity of creation and sustain and renew the life of the earth

Keynote speaker for the Convention is the Rev. Eric H. F. Law. He is the founder and executive director of the Kaleidoscope Institute for Competent Leadership in a Diverse Changing World.

The first day of convention recesses at 5:00PM. There is a social hour followed by dinner in the Convention Hall. The convention reconvenes on Saturday at 8:30am The closing Eucharist is at St John's Cathedral at 2:00PM.

Lent Begins February 13th

Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent and occurs 46 days before Easter. It is a moveable fast, falling on a different date each year because it is dependent on the date of Easter. It can occur as early as February 4 or as late as March 10.

According to the Canonical gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke, Jesus spent forty days fasting in the desert before the beginning of his public ministry. During this time, he gained clarity about his mission as he endured temptation by Satan. Ash Wednesday invites the faithful into a similar period of forty days of reflection, cleansing and discernment through the practices of prayer, study, fasting and special generosity.

Ash Wednesday derives its name from the practice of placing ashes on the foreheads of the faithful in a cross pattern. Worshippers traditionally retain the ashes until they wear off. They are a sign of mourning and repentance to God. The ashes used are created by burning the palms from the previous year's Palm Sunday.

Sunday morning, in Morristown, parishioners were awakening to find snow on the ground, wondering if they could make it to church. At Grace Point, the Vestry elected Pete Balling, Senior Warden; Alex Cunningham was elected Junior Warden; Louise Joyce was elected Clerk; Skeet Jernigan was elected Treasurer and the Finance Committee was appointed.

The work ahead has three aspects. First, and in the short term, bring the program year to a good close with a good Lent, a joyous Easter, a celebration of Confirmation and a "Good-Goodbye" to Pastor Scherry. This will be accomplished by the end of April. Second and in the meantime, our new Senior Warden will begin working with Canon Askew and the Bishop on securing a Consultant, the parish will hear about what kind of process is involved and the Vestry will get into position for calling an Interim Priest and naming a Search Committee.

Lastly, the oversight of the Vestry in the different ministry areas of the parish will insure that the work of learning, loving, serving, worshipping and caring goes forward.

Please hold the Vestry in your prayers and be of good cheer. Christ has overcome sin and death; this is an opportunity for growing in faith for the parish.

Come join us during the season of Lent on Wednesday evenings for a series of lessons and meditations on religious icons and the art of iconography. The program will be facilitated by Sarai Wender. Joining Sarai will be her friend (and Catholic Cousin) Mr. Wesley Lott. Wes is a long time lover of religious icons and has written and created many of his own through the years. He has attended many retreats and workshops that have lifted him spiritually to become a faithful student of this uplifting form of prayer and meditation. He comes to share with all of us.

We also plan to be using the wonderful book by Frederica Mathewes-Green "Open Door - Entering the Sanctuary of Icons." In this book, the author guides her readers into an imaginary Orthodox church to view and study twelve of the world's most significant religious icons. Perhaps we can discover how icons can become a part of our own life of prayer. Fascinating!

There is a sign up sheet in the parish hall for those who plan on attending these Lenten Wednesday gatherings. We will be ordering books based on the sign up.

The series begins on Wednesday evening, February 20th and runs through March 20th.

Worship during Lent

In preparation for Lent, we will close the season of Epiphany with two customs:

- On February 10, Epiphany Last, we will “bury” our Alleluia’s symbolically and will not say or sing that word again until the great proclamation of Easter.
 - At the Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper, we will burn the palm fronds that we saved from Palm Sunday Last.
- On Ash Wednesday, there will be three opportunities to receive the imposition of ashes, a sign to everyone we meet that we are mortal and that we need not only one another’s forgiveness, but also God’s. Those services are at 7AM-12N- and 7PM.
- On Sunday, February 17, the first Sunday of Lent, we begin the late service by singing “The Great Litany.” Parishioners will remain standing in the pews as the choir and ministers of the liturgy process around the edges of the congregation. “The Great Litany” is a long, intercessory prayer with various petitions that are said or sung by a leader. The congregation’s responses are fixed. This prayer was used as early as the 5th century and was the first rite prepared by Archbishop Thomas Cranmer. It was ordered to be used in procession by Henry VIII. The Great Litany takes the place of the prayers of the people at the Eucharist. The confession will also be omitted.
 - On the Second Sunday of Lent and for the remaining Sundays of Lent, the service will begin with the Penitential Order which is done from the entrance of the church. In addition, on that Sunday, we will add the names of those seeking baptism at Easter and those preparing for confirmation to our prayer list.
 - The choir will sing sections of a Bach oratorio as Introits beginning with Lent 2 through Palm Sunday.
 - I invite you to take on Lenten discipline at adding a midweek communion to your calendar.
 - Each Wednesday evening during Lent, there will be special programs: one for adults and the other for children.
 - If you wish to prepare for the Sacrament of Reconciliation, please speak to me soon.
 - And finally, if you wish to take on private disciplines for Lent and seek direction, please speak to me and we will try to find something that suits your temperament and spiritual journey.

Youth Service Focus for Confirmation: Hunger

Our young people gathered on MLK weekend for a 30 Hour Famine during which we were divided into tribes. The weekend was structured with brief learning moments supplied by DVD, then we played a competitive game which provided an experience after which we reflected on the learning. There were 13 young people who attended and 7 adults helped throughout the weekend.

As a result of the experience, our young people have taken on two, different goals related to hunger. The first goal is to raise enough money to feed 3 children in the Horn of Africa for one year. The cost to feed a child for one year is \$340. The second goal that our youth have determined is more hands-on and local. That is, we will be working with a local agency around the issue of hunger during March. There are donation sheets at the Flamingo Flocking Table for any in the parish who wish to donate money for hunger.

Upcoming Youth Retreat—February 16, 17 & 18

Our youth will leave Morristown on Saturday morning, February 16th for Whitewater Express, a year-round retreat center on the Ocoee River.

This Lenten weekend will be filled with a variety of activities including matters of spiritual import, creativity, fellowship and some high adventure activities—paintball, high ropes, mountain biking and horseback riding. Some meals are provided and for others, we will have our own KP.

Please hold these young people in your hearts and prayers as they find ways to deepen their own spiritual lives, their connections to one another and to the church.

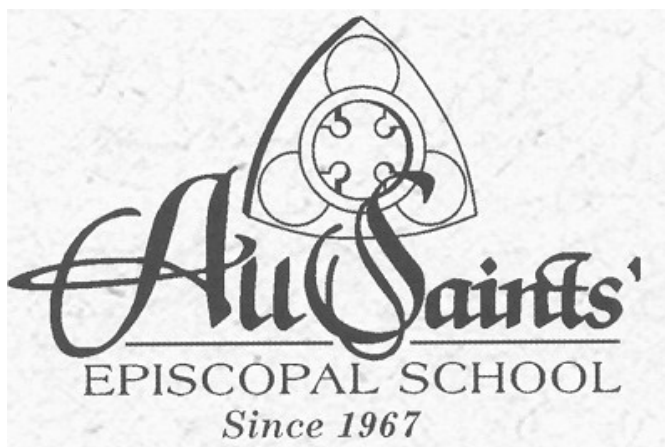
