

Easter Day Services

We have an unusual opportunity this year for celebrating Easter together.

As you are aware, the oldest service of the Christian tradition is "The Great Vigil." We have celebrated the Great Vigil on Saturday evenings after sundown for the last eight years. This year, we have an opportunity to move the service from 8:00PM on Saturday to 6:00AM on Sunday morning and make it a sunrise service complete with brass instruments and full choir. Imagine coming through the darkened streets of Morristown as did the women coming to the tomb so long ago! The service will unfold according to rubric: the lighting of the Paschal Fire, the recitation of God's mighty acts in history, baptisms and the declaration of Easter with Holy Noise followed by the celebration of the first Eucharist of Easter.

We should finish the service by 7:30am, just at sunrise!

There will be a brunch downstairs in the Memorial Room for choir, musicians and liturgical ministers, including altar guild and servers. The rest of the day will follow our usual pattern.

The 8:00AM service will take place as usual with the addition of organ for opening and closing hymns.

Our usual Festal Eucharist with choral anthems, brass and guest worshippers will take place at 10:30AM. Our children will visit the playground for an Egg Hunt after the service and an Easter lunch in the Parish Hall will follow. You will find information about the Flowering of the Children's Cross, the Egg Hunt and the Luncheon elsewhere in this newsletter.

Of special note is that Easter Day is the last Sunday that Fr. Henley will be with us. We want to recognize him and express our thanks. Instead of collecting a purse for his departure, we are inviting parishioners to provide gifts and

GOOD FRIDAY WORSHIP

We are a "Resurrection" people, but there is no way to get to Our Lord's resurrection without passing through his suffering and crucifixion. Thus Good Friday is the one day of the year when we pay particular attention to the Cross and its meaning.

6:30AM— Stations of the Cross—using readings and meditations, we follow the steps of Jesus from the events of the garden to the tomb.

12:00PM—The Good Friday liturgy is a reflective service with readings, prayers, choral anthems and meditations

There are two customs which enrich our worship for children on Easter Day.

1) Flowering of the Cross: It has been a longstanding tradition in Episcopal churches for children to bring garden flowers to the church on Easter Day and place them in a specially designed cross which is carried in procession and placed in front of the congregation during the principal service at 10:30 a.m.

Please encourage your child(ren) or grandchildren to take part in this ritual by helping them gather flowers late Saturday afternoon or early Sunday morning. Then bring the flowers to church Easter morning and help your children weave the flowers into the cross before the service.

2) Easter Egg Hunt at 11:45AM - For children through the fifth grade. Bring a basket and go to the playground at 11:45AM for the hunt.

The Episcopal Church is serious in its call to love, shelter, protect, and defend children within its own community and in the world. Children's enthusiastic expressions of faith can help transform the church and everyone in it! To assist children in fully participating in their church communities and in exploring their own ministries, we are blessed to provide imaginative innovative resources for those who work with children.

Children's Chapel is a worship education program that takes place during regular Sunday worship for children from age 5 to 10. They learn about and experience music and other elements of Christian worship. Kids go to Children's Chapel for a period during our 10:30 am worship service returning to the regular service for the Eucharist with their families.

In Chapel, our children get the chance to learn more about Faith and God's love for them – in a warm, inviting, and (of course) kid-friendly way. We are currently following a curriculum which parallels our liturgical year.

Godly Play is a method of Christian education and spiritual direction primarily for children aged 2- 12. The goal of *Godly Play* is to teach children the art of using religious language, parable, sacred story, silence, and liturgical action to help them become more fully aware of the mystery of God's presence around them and in their lives. *Godly Play* was developed by Episcopal priest, author, and teacher Jerome W. Berryman.

The *Godly Play* Curriculum is offered each Sunday for pre-school children and school age children up to fifth grade during the academic school year. There are trained *Godly Play* volunteer teachers that staff our *Godly Play* Worship.

In our *Godly Play* Worship Centers children have an opportunity to be with God, to talk to God, to listen to God, to wonder about God and, to hear stories of God. The children are surrounded by stories of Christian tradition; sacred stories from the Old and New Testaments, stories that Christ has given to all of us in the parables and stories about the liturgical cycle.

The mission of the Youth Program at All Saints' is to provide a balanced program of Christian Formation for High School and Middle School students. The focus of this formation is in four areas: Fellowship, Learning, Outreach, and Worship (FLOW). With the help of parents, we have updated the Youth Advisory Board Committee. This committee oversees the calendar, activities, programs, finances and outings of our youth spread over the FLOW ministry areas.

The Youth Flamingo Flocking Fundraiser to help finance a summer mission trip was a huge success! It is coming to an end and the youth are turning their focus to raising money for their 30 hour Famine Project. This is part of their outreach program. The goal is to raise enough money to feed 3 children in Africa for 1 year and also to undertake a hunger project with our own local agencies here in the Lakeway area. Related to this, the youth along with the younger children, will be helping the Outreach Committee with the Easter basket project for the Daily Bread.

This year's activities and commitments form a huge endeavor for the youth.

The youth will also be doing a *Hire-A-Youth* project for the months of March and April. This project is two fold. It provides hands on experience that they will be able to use on their mission trip and also provides financial support for them to go.

We have 9 youth taking part in Confirmation classes and activities. Each young person will shortly decide if he or she wishes to take this step. They will be confirmed by the Bishop on Wednesday, April 10th, 2013. I hope the parish can come and be witness for these young adults as they travel in their Faith journey.

The Youth Advisory Board is currently finishing up this years calendar of events and working on the upcoming calendar for Fall of 2013. I also want to Thank You for supporting our youth and their endeavors. Please keep us in your prayers and we continue to provide a moral compass for our children.

We need empty, plastic Easter eggs and treats for stuffing the eggs for the Easter Egg Hunt. Small items and/or candy works well. Our youth will fill the eggs and assemble Easter baskets for Daily Bread on Sunday, March 24, following the late service.

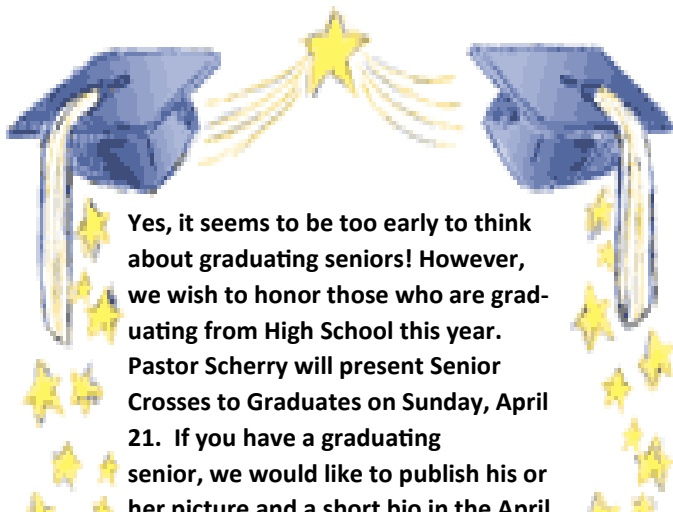
Outreach In Action

Since 1922, Episcopalians throughout the United States have engaged in one of the most venerable campaigns we have. It has been our custom to contribute the offerings gathered on Good Friday to the Diocese of Jerusalem and the Middle East.

Known simply as "The Good Friday Offering", contributions are gathered from all over the world to support the life of the church in the Middle East.

Over the last thirty years, the presence of Christians in the Middle East has shrunk from 10% to less than 2%. The Orthodox churches are the strongest in this diocese, but the Episcopal Church has a vital and essential presence in the Holy Land – in churches, schools, hospitals and St. George's University.

Use of the Good Friday Offering is as varied and as widespread as are the needs. One year, the Good Friday Offering might be used for theological education or for putting a roof on a church building. It might be used to start a new congregation or for salaries for a hospital or for a school.

You can find out more about the work of the Diocese of Jerusalem and the Middle East by logging onto the Episcopal Church website at www.episcopalchurch.org/gfo. It is vital that we continue to share in this burden, and not let our brothers and sisters in Jerusalem carry the cross alone.
