- Aerosol cans
- Antifreeze
- Batteries
- Cleaners
- Electronics such as computers, fax machines, cell phones, and televisions
- Fertilizer
- Fluorescent light bulbs
- Lubricants
- Motor oil
- Paint
- Pesticides
