



SignUp Genius Update

Last year SignUpGenius was introduced to CSOL® as an electronic way to sign-up as a volunteer for the many activities that CSOL® sponsors. We used it for signing up volunteers for DSH house-sitting a year ago and for refreshment sign-ups for the Tour of Homes in November, 2015.

This year we are implementing SignUpGenius for most of our Designer Showhouse volunteer activities and look forward to using it for our other big events this year: Swing for the Symphony, the Tour of Homes and other CSOL® sponsored fund-raisers.

Why use SignUpGenius? It is an easy way for individuals to sign up for volunteering time without having to play phone tag with activity chairpeople; volunteers can see at a glance what slots are open and what works best for their personal schedules. They can delete or change their time slots as their personal schedules change and SignUpGenius sends them email reminders several days in advance to advise them of their upcoming volunteer schedule.

For activity chairpeople, they can get an at-aglance view of how the volunteer schedule is filling in and where there are gaps in the schedule that need to be filled.

For the CSOL® as a whole, the reports that are created give us a list of who our previous volunteers have been, what roles they have served in, how many volunteers have been needed for which events, how many total volunteer hours our organization has provided, etc.

SignUp Genius is a great tool for the CSOL® volunteer corps which is spread over many miles and who are using all kinds of devices: PCs, Apples, iPads and even iPhones! SignUpGenius is web-based and no special software needs to be loaded on one's computer to use it.

Thanks to the many CSOL® volunteers who have already jumped in and started using this tool to schedule their volunteer hours. We are all learning how to use this valuable tool together. If
