The scholarship auditions would not be possible without the tireless efforts of members of the education committee who staffed the auditions for over 20 hours across three days, not to mention the hours invested in scheduling auditions, preparing food, contacting recipients, securing gifts for judges, and on and on. Equally committed were our judges: Barry Goldsmith, Barbara Borg, John Holley and Chris Clark. We are also very grateful to the College of Charleston for providing such wonderful space for the auditions.

The Education Committee invites you to a recital on May 1, 3:00, Bishop Gadsden Chapel on James Island. The college scholarship recipients, including the 2016 Stahl Scholar, and the two Goldsmith Scholars will perform followed by a reception.

Elliott Cihlar, violinist, was awarded the David and Karen Stahl Memorial Scholarship for college study (\$2,500). Anna Neely, vocalist, Emily Caron, bassoonist. Amelia Wingard, oboist, and Chloe

McLeod Plantation was a vast plantation located just across the river from Charleston on the Ashley


