

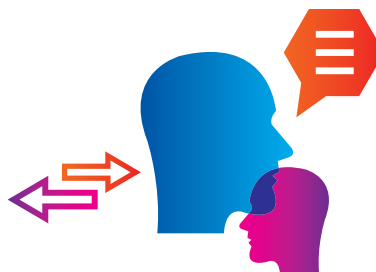

### ORDINATION PREP

The SFM trains priests and deacons for ordained ministry in San Diego. Vocational deacons take the two-year track. The priest track is three years. Aspiring deacons and priests alike engage in field education.
