Considerations

- Drop-down organization is hierarchical per diocesan mission & activities
- Each drop-down listing is a category not an individual page/item
- Thus, organization is not alphabetical, which would make more sense for itemization not categorization

- On seeing categories, users should examine drop-down menus in order to find the category that best suits their search needs
- A navigation menu that's easy to use for what the most general use of the site will be results in more people clicking through the menu from the homepage, which improves Google search result placement. Currently, the nav menu and site search functions are being by-passed by the most frequent users by going to Google/other search directly to find the pages/items they need [Source: Diocesan Communications Committee Report, 2015].
