FROM MIKKA'S DESK: SYNOD ASSEMBLIES AND BEYOND

Dear ELCA World Hunger Leaders and Friends,

I've been a guest at six ELCA synod assemblies this season, including the Rocky Mountain, Southeastern Minnesota, Northwestern Minnesota, Nebraska, Eastern North Dakota synods and most recently, the New England Synod. Overall, through presence of ELCA World Hunger staff and your important local synod leadership, ELCA World Hunger will be present at more than HALF of the 62 synod assemblies gathered this season!



Through our combined witness, many ELCA Lutherans who so faithfully give and support this ministry will be encouraged and thanked, and many others who are looking for a way to be involved will have made that first connection. Thank you!

Listening in at six synod assemblies allowed me to observe some trends, namely that we are on the verge of a leadership crisis. According to some bishops' accounts, the average age of ELCA clergy is 61. On the reverse side of the coin, we have 40-45 percent fewer people enrolling in seminary each year as compared to 10 years ago. In some synods, there are no interns available for formation and service.

Let us ask the Lutheran question, "What does this mean for us?" As a church of the Reformation, next year, we will mark the 500th anniversary of our tradition. We, as a volunteer network of 2,000+ Lutherans, who want to see an end to poverty and hunger and a just world where all are fed – we can kick into high gear!

The church of tomorrow will need a hybrid leader who sees both Word and Sacrament and Word and Service ministry as inherently connected and feels the connection between the church within the four walls and outside the building. The church will need those folks in rostered and lay ministry, and we can help lead the way.

Thanks to you and counting you, we are on the way there. Over the summer, keep an eye out. Invite a friend, a colleague, a congregation member to join the ELCA World Hunger cause – we are church for the sake of the world!




Featured topic: ELCA World Hunger Leadership Gathering in review!

BY THE NUMBERS: THE CAMPAIGN FOR THE ELCA

Thank you for all your hard work and support for ELCA World Hunger's 40 Days of Giving! ELCA World Hunger's 40 Days of Giving was launched in Lent 2016 as a way to kick off ELCA World Hunger's year of emphasis within the life of Always Being Made New: The Campaign for the ELCA. There were 449 congregations registered for the initiative with nearly 10 percent of registrants exceeding their fundraising goals!

The initiative's was raising an additional \$2 million from congregations during Lent*. Congregational gifts given during the initiative totaled \$1,457,114**. All gifts given to ELCA World Hunger during Lent 2016 totaled \$3,125,154**. These totals do not represent all the Lenten gifts, however, as gifts given by participating congregations continue to come in. Once again, thank you for your generosity!

* Gifts were counted from Feb. 7, 2016, to April 15, 2016, or the duration of ELCA World Hunger's 40 Days of Giving.
