
## **PLC Details**

- PLC registration opens July 18 at www.spselca.org
  - \$150/person with on-site stay
  - \$180/person with off-site stay
  - Fees increase after Sep 18
- Rooms at The Village at Squaw Valley

## **Building a Community of Lutheran Leaders**



This year, the **Professional Leaders Conference** will be held at The Village at Squaw Valley in Olympic Valley, CA—near Lake Tahoe. During our time, **The Rev. Dr. Kirsi Stjerna** will speak on **Reformation: Past, Present and Future.** 

PLC starts on Tuesday, October 18 (with dinner at 6 PM) and ends on Thursday, October 20 just before lunch. Breakfasts are 'on your own.' Remember... each suite has a full kitchen!

More **PLC** information, the PLC registration link and room block reservation information for Squaw Valley is located at www.spselca.org starting Monday, July 18, 2016.

**PLC** registration costs start at \$150 per person for rostered leaders, partners/spouses, or ministry partners, with an on-site stay — at The Village at Squaw Valley. Costs are higher for those staying off-site.

We have a *limited room block* of one to three bedroom 'condo-like' suites which include full kitchens. These spaces are available for approximately \$340/one bedroom, \$225 per person for two or three room suites, based on a two-night stay —and depending on the room accommodation chosen or available at the time of reservation.

**Room accommodations** are in addition to PLC registration costs and hotel reservations must be made by Sep 18 to obtain the reduced room rate (while supply lasts). Be sure to check on the cancellation policy when making your reservation!

## For Professional Leaders Conference

Tuesday evening: "In Luther's Footsteps: Theology of Freedom and Freedom Fighters" This plenary reinterprets the story of the German reformation with Luther and his theology of freedom, its impact in recent world history, and identification of Luther's Catechism as a source for the theology of freedom.

Wednesday morning: "Why and What Should Lutherans Know of Reformation Mothers? This session introduces significant Reformation mothers and their contribution to the Lutheran protestant tradition. This time will be a chance to address the many issues around gender/sex & sexuality, equality & justice, inclusivity & inclusive language, the priesthood of all believers, and sola scriptura principles vis-à-vis the Lutheran tradition.

Wednesday evening: Stations of the Reformation... a kaleidoscope of shared Reformation resources and information for use in our congregations as we approach our 500th Anniversary of the Lutheran Reformation. Think about what you will bring and share!

Thursday morning: "Reformation 2017 Challenges and Possibilities" With "Word and Faith", Vol 2, Annotated Luther (Fortress Press), a look at major developments in recent Lutheran theology, naming the growing edges in Lutheran language and identity for the future, new work on new issues, efforts to re-energize & reform Lutheran theological language and involvement.
