\$4.25 Million More for Adult Basic Education

- Scale up strategies for linking basic skills to employability in the current labor market.
- Develop curriculum and technology to meet the demands of the new high school equivalency exam (HiSET) and the rigors of College and Career Readiness Standards for adult education.
- Reach more of the 16,000 adults currently on the wait list¹.
- Better compensation for adult education staff to reduce turnover and improve programs.

Adult Basic Education: Massachusetts Doesn't Work Without It!

- **Economic Inequality:** The average dropout can expect to earn an annual income of \$20,241. That's a full \$10,386 less than the typical high school graduate, and \$36,424 less than someone with a bachelor's degree.²
- **K-12 Education:** The best indicator of a child's success in school is the education level of the parents.³
- **Health:** Low literacy is linked to increased mortality, hospitalization, and poorer control of chronic illness.⁴
- **Civic Engagement:** Voting behavior is strongly correlated with educational attainment. In 2008, 34% of those without a high school diploma voted, compared to 51% with a high school credential and 65% of those with some college.⁵
- **Criminal Justice:** Among dropouts between the ages of 16 and 24, incarceration rates were 63 times higher than among college graduates, and 70% of offenders never finished high school.⁶
