Fendall Hall, one of Alabama's outstanding Italianate houses, contains elaborate and rare interior decorative paintings dating from the 1880s. Completed in 1860 by Edward and Anna Young, it was home to five generations of the Young family. Among its many treasures are family and period furnishings, marble mantles, and a black and white marble tiled entry. The five-acre site includes gardens and archaeological features.

Today, the Alabama Historical Commission owns this significant site and the Friends of Fendall Hall operate the site.
