ME 675/975 Mission & the Global Church



► **The Rt. Rev. Dr. Grant LeMarquand**
An exploration of the biblical, ancient and global roots of Christian mission in order to engage contemporary mission concerns such as Islam, persecution of Christians, and issues of ecological and economic justice. Students will attend the Ancient Evangelical Future Conference.

OT 700 Hebrew Exegesis



► **Dr. Don Collett**
Extensive translation work in various genres of the Old Testament. Prerequisite BL630 (2 weeks)

NT 500 New Testament



► **Dr. Wesley Hill**
A survey of God's self-revelation in Jesus Christ and formation of a new covenant people in the Church. The course will emphasize biblical content, knowledge of the historical background to the New Testament events and documents, and basic concepts of New Testament theology.

PT 670 Introduction to Lutheran Liturgy (L)

ME 600 Evangelism & Church Planting



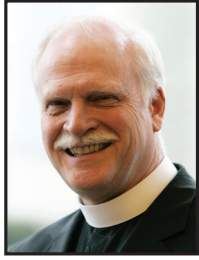
► **The Rev. Canon Dr. John Macdonald**
