Perennials come up every year by themselves, and we are fortunate to be working with the same grower whose perennials have been lovingly handled and organically grown. There are a good number of new offerings this year, as well as popular "oldies", each with a brief description. Additional plants will be available on the day of the sale.

Annuals last only for the summer, and offer instant color to the garden. We will have flats of many varieties available on the 10th: begonias, marigolds, petunias, dahlias, etc. Geraniums, New Guinea Impatiens, and many more will be available in individual 4 ½ " pots - all from the same grower we have had for the past sixteen years, chosen because the quality of her plants is so good!

The Flower Sale Committee welcomes you to our 2015 sale! We had been speaking about how this had been a particularly long, snowy and cold Winter, followed by a very cold Spring. This has had a very direct effect on our sale: as of this writing, there is almost nothing to see in the two nurseries we use, when they were filled with color at this time last year – sometimes you can't get around Mother Nature! On a practical level, this means that some of our offerings are being ordered sight-unseen – the nurseries cannot guarantee the exact color choices which will be available. And numerous items from the past are not available this year. Still, we're confident that, despite the late start to the growing season, there will be lots of wonderful offerings to brighten your garden and bring on the color...!

CCDF started the “before Mother's Day” Plant Sale 22 years ago. The sale has increased in popularity due to the quality and variety of both our colorful flats of annuals and our well-rooted gallon-size containers of perennials ready to plant in your garden. We have numerous experienced gardeners and plant enthusiasts at the sale who will be happy to assist you with your purchases and make suggestions. And we'll offer several garden ideas, for a variety of different yard conditions.

Our prices are lower than you will find at the nurseries for the same plant quality. Plant offerings include old stand-bys and new varieties - plants that need a sunny spot and plants that do well in part shade or in full shade. You are sure to find the right plant for the right spot – we'll have a great variety on hand.

As stated in the 'Grower's' Perennial newsletter, quoting Ralph Waldo Emerson, *The Earth Laughs in Flowers...* “Any way you view your flowers, they are sure to make you smile, to make you laugh. What a spectacular place we have here: our Earth; the home we all collectively share. Earth laughs in flowers, and it is urging us to do the same.”

I - PERENNIALS

Prices: \$11.00 each, or \$20 for any two (except where marked)

Please note - because of the **very late start** of the growing season this Spring, we will order fewer perennials than usual; most will be available by pre-order only. While many of the perennials will be considerably smaller this year than in previous, they will still grow to their normal size and condition within a few weeks.

“DR” = drought resistant * “BTR” = attracts butterflies * “HB” = attracts hummingbirds

- AGASTACHE - ‘*Coronado Red*’ Sun, 24-30”. Vibrant dark orange flowers, mature to scarlet-red throughout the summer. The flowers are held upright above silvery, aromatic foliage. This long-season bloomer will do well in a hot, dry, sunny garden where it will be a great hummingbird attractant! DR, HB
- ARUNCUS - ‘*Noble Spirits*’ Shade/Pt.Shade, 8-12”. Petite, creamy white panicles sit atop light green, deeply-cut foliage. The foliage gives the appearance of a lacy fern, but with the bonus of white flowers in summer.
- ASCLEPIAS - ‘*Butterfly Weed*’ Sun/Lt. Shade. This bushy, perennial is prized for its large, flat-topped clusters of bright-orange flowers. The leaves are mostly alternate, pointed, and smooth on the edge. The yellow-orange to bright orange flower clusters, 2–5 inches across, are at the top of the flowering stem. 2-3’ BTR
- ASTILBE - ‘*Visions in Pink*’ Hardy pest-free shade plants with finely divided foliage and airy cloud blooms. Low maintenance! ‘Shade/Sun. 18-20”. This Astilbe blooms later than most in mid-summer with pale-pink flower plumes.
- CAMPANULA
Carpatica ‘*Blue Clips*’ Sun/Pt.Shade, 12”. Light-blue, upright, bell-shaped flowers cover this mounding perennial’s green foliage. Blooms from early summer to mid-fall. Enjoys well-drained soil.
- Punctata ‘*Cherry Bells*’ Sun, 24-30”. Large, tubular, bell-like, drooping flowers are cherry red-purple. Blooms June-July on vigorous, spreading foliage.
- CHRYSOGONUM - ‘*Pierre*’Golden Star Sun/part shade. A native groundcover grown for its foliage and flowers. Light green, triangular leaves provide a beautiful

backdrop for star shaped, golden flowers in spring and again in fall. You'll may get a sporadic in the heat of the summer as well.

COREOPSIS

'Cosmic Eye', Sun, 12-15"

Distinct flowers boast a deep red eye surrounded by a ring of golden yellow and an orange button eye. Medium-textured foliage. This coreopsis will bloom summer through fall.

Big Bang 'Galaxy'

Sun, 10-12". A great new coreopsis for the front of the border! Low, mounding medium-textured foliage is covered with strongly branches stems that hold butter-yellow, double daisy flowers summer through fall. DR

DICENTRA - Bleeding Heart

Shade/Part Shade. Unique pink flowers dangle from arching stems in late spring. Bleeding Heart will die back to the ground as the summer heats up, but it will return next spring! A classic that everyone loves! 30"

ECHINACEA - Coneflower

'Magnus'

Sun, 32". Large, upright, orange-brown cones are central to pink-purple petals that are held horizontally. A standard in the perennial garden, this coneflower will bloom from summer through the fall, attracting tons of butterflies! DR, BTR

'Pink Double Delight'

Sun, 23". A nice, fairly compact, well-branching cone flower. Bright pink-purple flowers boast a fluffy, double pink center! Blooms well summer to fall. Deadhead if blooming slows. DR

GALLIUM 'Sweet Woodruff'

Pt Shade. Rapidly spreading perennial groundcover that prefers a cool, moist shady location for best appearance. White flowers in late spring. 6-8"

GERANIUM - Cranesbill Geranium

Note - the two offerings below are classic perennial geraniums, which return yearly.

Azure Rush' Cranesbill

Pt.Sun, 18". An improved variety of 'Rozanne' boasting more vigorous branching which blooms more flowers! Pale purple flowers bloom continuously all season long!

Westray' Dwarf Cranesbill

Pt. Sun, 8-12". A low-growing hybrid geranium with bright pink flowers covering masses of green foliage. Blooms in spring through early summer. Will remain evergreen in some locations.

GEUM – ‘Totally Tangerine’

Sun, 24”. This perennial will form a low mound of fuzzy green leaves giving way to tall branching stems holding bright tangerine-orange blooms. Blooms all summer long and is favored by butterflies. Deadhead to encourage more buds to form. BTR

HELLEBOROUS - *Lenten Rose*

‘Ivory Prince’

Shade/Pt.Shade, 12-18”. Burdundy-pink flower buds open to creamy white, outward-facing flowers. Flowering usually starts in March and will hold its blooms until mid-spring. Nice compact, leathery, evergreen foliage holds up well through the year. A very nice addition to the shaded garden. DR

‘Peppermint Ice’

Shade/Pt.Shade, 18-22”. Beautiful, large, ruffled double petals bloom in shades of soft to medium pink with varying degrees of peppermint veining and a picotee edge. DR

HEMEROCALLIS - *Daylilies*

Daylilies are the background of every perennial garden. Hardy, long-lived, low maintenance plants that spread over time and adapt to a variety of light and soil conditions. Nearly indestructible, they come in many varieties, colors and bloom times. The three we offer this season are new to us, and are a nice contrast to some of the more common varieties.

‘Little Heavenly Angel’ Daylily

Sun, 16-20”. Once this daylily becomes established in your garden it will provide you with an explosion of pink-purple 3.5” across flowers. Each petal has a distinct white midrib making this flower stand out!

‘Red Pinnacle’ Daylily

Sun, 28”. Enormous 10-11” wide, lightly fragrant flowers wave like flags in the midseason garden. This spectacular daylily has long, curly, pinched red-purple petals with a huge gold throat that radiates out into the petals. A very unique selection that will garner attention!

‘Stella D’Oro’ Daylily

Sun, 12”. A popular one! Golden yellow flowers bloom much of the season. Will spread slowly into substantial patches.

HEUCHERA

‘Mint Frost’ Coral Bells

Pt.Shade, 12-18”. Fancy, scalloped leaves with bright green veins with a silvery overlay. Taller sprays of ivory flowers appear in late spring, held on deep red stems. Pinkish fall color.

'Obsidian' Coral Bells

Pt. Shade, 18". Mounds of large, smooth, jet-black leaves. Sprays of creamy flowers appear in June. This is probably the darkest leaved heucheras on the market.

HEUCHERELLA - 'Buttered Rum'

Sun/Shade, 10". Caramel-dipped, deeply-cut maple leaves adorn this aptly named plant from spring to summer. In fall, the cool weather burnishes the leaves to a lovely rose red. This plant will brighten up a shady spot in the garden. Looks great planted next to purple-leaved Heucheras and deep-green hostas.

KNIPHOFIA - 'Elwira' Red-Hot Poker

Sun, 24-36". Impressive hot orange flowers in 8-10" long terminal racemes are borne throughout the summer. Each flower spike will provide color for over 2 weeks. Hummingbirds are attracted to it! Well-draining soil is a must. DR, HB

LAVANDULA - Lavender

Lavender is a wonderful, fragrant addition to any perennial garden. It loves dry, sunny conditions, and needs little maintenance. Our source consistently send us wonderful, healthy plants which thrive!

'Dilly Dilly' Lavender, Sun, 12"

English and French cross with improved fragrance, hardiness and vigor. Nice compact habit with beautiful bushy flower spikes held above the foliage.

'Provence' Lavender, Sun, 30"

Light purple flowers in spring are very fragrant, and dry beautifully for potpourri. "Provence" is more moisture tolerant than other varieties.

LEUCANTHEMUM

'Victorian Secret' Shasta Daisy

Sun, 16". A compact Shasta producing ruffled white petals, single to semi-double, surrounding a yellow button eye, blooming continuously throughout the summer

LIGULARIA

'Brit Marie Crawford'

Shade/Pt.Shade, 24-36". A standout plant in the shaded garden! Large, dark, leathery leaves (to 7" long by 9" wide) have wavy, serrated margins. The leaves a deep, dark purple, with a brighter purple peeking out from underneath. The plant appears prehistoric once it has matured in the garden. Tall spikes of bright, bold golden-yellow-orange daisy-like flowers appear in August through September.

LYSMACHIA - 'Golden Alexander' Loosetrife

Pt.Shade, 24". Bright gold and green variegated foliage and bright golden-yellow flowers in midsummer.

LOBELIA CARDINALIS

'Cardinal Flower', Part Shade

Brilliant shade of cardinal red. Hardy green leaves. Often seen along woodland paths. Spires of colorful hood-like flowers on stately spikes in late summer and fall. Likes moist soil. 30"

MONARDA - Beebalm

'Petite Delight' Beebalm, Sun

12-15". Unique lavender-rose flower heads appear on very compact mounds of dark green crinkled foliage in June-August. Attracts hummingbirds, resistant to deer and will spread each season. HB

'Grand Mum' Beebalm

Sun, 15-18". Mauve pink flowers and dark green leaves on this Monarda make it perfect for the garden or large containers. Highly resistant to mildew, it has a compact, rounded form topped with plump pink flowers from mid to late summer. The Hummingbirds love it! DR, HB

NEPETA – Catmint

Catmint is a hearty, dependable plant which is perfect for sunny, dry spots in the garden. It needs little care, and yes, cats love it!

'Dropmore' Catmint'

Sun, 18". Tall and neatly upright, this Nepeta will withstand hot, dry locations with no problem! Soft, lavender flowers bloom spring to fall. Once the flowers begin to fade in mid-summer, shear the entire plant back for a full flush of new growth. Nice, aromatic foliage is attractive to us but not to deer! DR

'Blue Wonder' Catmint

Sun, 12". A wonderful, petite selection of catmint. Long-blooming blue/purple flowers are irresistible to pollinators. Aromatic foliage will deter deer. Blooms from spring to frost. DR

OENOTHERA

'Siskiyou' Mexican Evening Primrose

Sun/Pt.Sun, 8-10". A long-blooming, spreading, vigorous groundcover for a sunny garden. Soft-pink flowers with yellow centers bloom May-July with a sporadic bloom throughout the summer.

PENSTEMON

'Red Riding Hood', Sun/Part Sun 18-24". Eye-catching neon-bright red tubular blooms attract hummingbirds like crazy. The flowers

arise on long, slender stems that sway in the summer breeze. Flowers begin blooming in June and will continue throughout the season, with the heaviest bloom happening early. HB

PHLOX PANICULATA

'Peppermint Twist', Sun

Another standard of the perennial garden, in many colors and sizes

This was a favorite a few seasons ago! Stunning white and pink striped petals give a sweet candy-cane appearance to this stout, compact phlox! 16"

'Robert Poore'

Sun, 3-4'. An old fashioned tall garden phlox with large panicles of pink-purple flowers in late-summer.

RUDBECKIA - Black-Eyed Susan

'Goldstrum'. Sun. Flowers in a consistent deep golden yellow on upright plants that reach 40in. It blooms prodigiously from late July to early October. A garden classic!

SEDUM - Stonecrop

'Voodoo'

Sun, 3-6" Low-growing, sprawling, mat-forming sedum that does great as a ground cover in a sandy, well-drained, warm location. Dark-green foliage is tinged burgundy. Red-magenta flower clusters cover the plant in mid-summer. In some winters you'll have the plant remain evergreen.

'Autumn Fire' Showy Stonecrop

Sun, 18-23". An improvement on 'Autumn Joy'. Taller, stronger stems tend to hold their flowers up better than other varieties. Plants produce green broccoli-like buds in mid-summer, which gradually open into large dusty-rose flower heads, finally deepening to rich rusty-red during autumn.

SALVIA - Sage

'Caradonna', sun, 30"

Glowing purple stems loaded with violet-purple flowers that bloom from June to October. With its gray-green aromatic foliage, it makes an attractive accent all summer long. DR

'May Night' Sage, Sun

Flowers of deep indigo violet-blue. Remove faded blooms to encourage repeat flowering. Excellent for cutting and drought tolerant! 18" DR

VIOLA - "Heartthrob" Violet

Shade/Pt.Shade, 6-8". A great new interesting groundcover violet! Classic lavender violet flowers, with the drama of a deep

burgundy heart-shaped blotch on each leaf. Color maintains throughout the season. Plant where you won't mind it spreading!!

FERNS

'Regal Red' Japanese Painted Fern

Pt.Shade/Shade, 12-18". Striking violet red fronds are contrasted by bright silver edges, giving an overall tapestry effect. Gives a soft-textured look to the shaded garden.

'The King' Ostrich Fern

Shade, 3-7'. Clump-forming, upright to arching, deciduous fern. The showy parts of this fern are the finely dissected, medium green, vegetative fronds which exhibit the feathery appearance of long ostrich plumes.

PAEONIA – Peony

'Sarah Bernhardt' Peony, Sun

Both varieties of peony below are \$15

Ruffles of sweetly scented pink petals bloom in mid to late spring. 30-36"

Paeonia 'Felix Crousse' Peony

Sun, 28". Brilliant, fluffy, carmine-red double petal blooms are held above the foliage in late spring-early summer. Wonderful sweet scent.

BUTTERFLY BUSHES

\$16. Butterfly Bushes (BUDDLEIA) love sunny spots. For best growing and blooming performance, add some lime to the soil, and cut them back to about 12" every spring. They will return to their maximum height by the end of fall. Once established, butterfly bushes can tolerate drought. Of course, they are a huge butterfly attractor!

Buddleia 'Attraction'

Sun, 4-6'. A more compact butterfly bush, forming a somewhat rounded shape. Vibrant, royal red to magenta fragrant flowers occur in six to ten inch long nodding panicles from summer into fall. Cut spent flowers before they go to seed to encourage repeat flowering. Butterflies will flock to it! BTR

Buddleia 'Black Knight'

Sun, 6-8'. Features spike-like 4-10" long terminal clusters of dark-purple flowers which bloom from June to September and sometimes to first frost. Fragrant flowers are attractive to butterflies. Silvery-green willow-like foliage. BTR

WAIT – still no IMPATIENS...?

Many gardeners throughout the country found their Impatiens sick and then dying by midsummer in 2012. The cause of this was Downy Mildew, a devastating disease spread through air and the spreading of spores due to rain and overhead watering. It was prevalent throughout our area, and caused in part by weather conditions (a cool spring followed by a hot summer). There are no effective treatments for Downy Mildew. Once it has occurred in a garden, the only way to prevent it in the future is to stop planting Impatiens for several years. Because of this, we will again not sell Impatiens this year.

So – *what to plant instead?* First, New Guinea Impatiens are NOT susceptible to Downey Mildew, so they can be planted safely. Then, we also recommend the following:

Part Sun – Shade: Begonia (many varieties) Coleus, Lobelia, New Guinea Impatiens, Sweet Potato Vine. It was our experience the past two summers that Begonias of any variety were an excellent, dependable substitute for Impatiens.

Sun: Petunias (many varieties), Vinca, Zinnia, Scavoela, Angelonia.

Even if you did not get Downey Mildew last summer, we strongly suggest that you do NOT plant regular Impatiens this year.

PLEASE NOTE: as mentioned above, our source for Annuals is running several weeks behind schedule, due to the extremely cold Spring. They could not, at this writing, guarantee that they will be able to provide every color in the plants listed below. Since they consistently provide such wonderful, healthy plants, we trust their desire to send us only plants which are to their usual high standard.

Sunset, Nadine, Bridget, Dusty Rose

HIEMALLIS

Rose, orange, yellow, light pink, red

BEGONIA WHOPPER

Mixed, red w/green leaf, pink w/bronze leaf

GARDENING TIPS

Most perennials prefer a good, weed-free, well drained soil which is able to maintain moisture. Most prefer a soil pH of between 5.5 to 6.5. For those that prefer a more alkaline soil, lime may be added. For those that prefer a more acid soil, sulfur may be added.

Dig the soil to a depth of about 12", or more if possible. This will give the roots plenty of room to grow. You can now incorporate bone meal, or other fertilizers (if you wish) at the manufacturer's recommended rate.

HOW TO PLANT

Container-grown perennials may be planted anytime the soil is workable, from early spring to early fall. Carefully remove the plant from the container and plant at the same depth it was in the container. Firm the soil around the plant to remove any air pockets around the root system. Water the plants thoroughly. It is best to mulch all plantings especially for their first winter to minimize any damage from frost heaving the plant from the soil and drying the roots.
