## Indy Students Sweep Math Competition

Middle School students at Indiana Life Sciences Academy (ILSA) in Indianapolis recently placed first, second, and third in the Indy City Math Contest, sponsored by Sumdog.com.

The online math competition tested student proficiency on up to 1,000 problems and equations. ILSA's winners were proficient on 95%, 94% and 93% of the materials.

Two ILSA classrooms also scored high marks. Seventh graders took second place overall, and 8th graders took third place, besting 23 other competing classrooms. Utilizing math strategies, logic and reasoning in the contest's gaming format, students applied math content and knowledge along with computer skills to successfully compete.
