THE KENTUCKY PERSON-CENTERED CARE PROGRAM FOR LONG TERM CARE



The Kent School of Social Work at the University of Louisville received a CMP grant to undertake a program to improve resident quality of care through increased use of Person-Centered Care practices. These initiatives and activities will include:

- Creation of a Leadership Initiative of 50 Certified Nursing Homes (CNH) to participate
 in on-site day-long individual facility consultation and training with a Clinical Nurse
 Specialist/LTC Nurse consultant. They will assist management and senior staff and
 CNAs with the completion of the *Artifacts of Culture Change* survey as well as QAPI
 Action Planning. Each Leadership Initiative facility will have free access to monthly
 PCC webinars with Carmen Bowman. Slots still available for those interested.
- Four two-day Regional PCC Conferences across the state for LTC with free registration for up to three (3) representatives from each certified nursing home requiring at least one CNA to attend. Registration and food are covered for the two days (lodging not included).
