SUMMERTIME BLUES?

Many churches consider the summer as a time to back off and do less. While each of us need a break sometimes, summer can be a critical time for church growth. July is a great time to plan plenty of fun events such as cook outs, ice cream parties, and pool parties that offer newcomers a chance to get to know people in the church. In an area with a large military presence such as ours, August and September are often prime months for people looking for a church home in a new city. Provide guests who are new to the area a gift bag with information about the community. A lot of times local businesses are happy to provide discount coupons to add to the bag.

Summer children's activities are still good ways to connect with new people. Some churches do well with a traditional VBS, while others get creative with adventure camps, music camps, sports camps, and other ways of engaging children. Many are finding evenings work just as well as mornings, making it easier for working people to volunteer.

I'm not suggesting more "busy-ness" but rather a focused effort to reach out. Instead of church-wide parties, why not challenge several church members to host a cookout at their home. Two or three couples (or a small group) could get together and share the cost of the food. Then the host family could invite their neighbors to come to the cookout. Keep it casual, and have fun. Another idea for summer is a series of simple service projects. With the later sunset during these months, evening projects are possible. Explore the needs of the community surrounding your church building, and plan some projects to help meet these needs. Invite the neighbors to join in these efforts.

All of these ideas have the added benefit of showing unchurched people that church people can have fun, and that we care about our communities. Don't worry about "hitting them over the head" with the gospel right away. But be ready if they ask. First Peter 3.15 says "Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect." Why not commit to making this summer a time for your church to reach out to unchurched people and to people new to the community!
