## Wednesday 10<sup>th</sup> and 31<sup>th</sup> - 10:00 AM- "CANOE MOSQUITO LAGOON"

Reservations will begin a week before the canoe date. Join a guide as you explore this rich and diverse estuary up close. Some experience is preferred. You must be at least 8 years old and able to paddle. You must wear covered shoes (no sandals, flip-flops or crocs). Bring water, sunscreen and a hat. Dress to get wet. Saturday 13<sup>th</sup> – 10:00 AM - "ESTUARIES: SEEING THE UNSEEN" Explore the unseen world of microscopic plankton from Mosquito Lagoon. Learn about the importance of Estuaries and the role of plankton within the Estuary. Capture plankton samples with a plankton net, and view them through a microscope inside the Visitor Center. Meet at the Visitor Center at 10:00 a.m. (1 hour)

Saturday 20<sup>th</sup> – 10:00 AM "ENDANGERED ANIMAL SPECIES" Discover how many endangered animals use the national seashore. Some are year round residents, others are here only during the summer and some pass through during their migrations. We will discuss all 15 animal species. Meet at the Visitor Center at 10:00 a.m. (1 hour).
