

KDS 5th Graders Visit Constitution Village and Early Works Museum

One hundred five KDS fifth graders, along with their teachers, visited Constitution Village and Early Works Museum in Huntsville, Alabama, in April. This trip was a culmination of a year's study which included Native Americans, transportation throughout the Continental United States, and the Alabama Constitution.



Students toured the Early Works Museum, exploring exhibits about U.S. presidents, Native Americans, keel boats, and African American history.

At Constitution Village, the students walked into an atmosphere that was set in the year 1819. The students created cornhusk dolls, watched a blacksmith create metal goods, participated in a group discussion about medicinal plants, learned about the history of surveying land in Alabama, and created a newsletter from the print shop.



This field trip enabled these students to “walk through history,” connecting classroom learning to actual historical sites.
