Training Description

Cultural experiences and societal dynamics, for better and for worse, are fundamental dimensions of every human being's life and should be integrated into a general clinical approach. For many people, personal identity is intertwined with social identity and the welfare of one's cultural groups. Culturally linked experiences and values can be sources of great meaning and sustaining personal resources. At the same time, hostile social forces of discrimination, stigmatization and oppression can define or confine an individual's sense of self and position in society. Whether explicit or more implicit, the many "isms" that persist in the world can limit human potential and threaten fundamental human dignity.

The impact of culturally based trauma can be understood and treated effectively with added awareness and specific strategies throughout the 8-Phase EMDR treatment approach. This workshop will help identify client manifestations of internalized stigma/oppression and externalized prejudice toward others as they link to client difficulties. Keys to assessment, preparation and target selection will be covered.

Research supported information and theory form the fields of social psychology and social work will be integrated within the AIP model to predict the profound and unique capacity EMDR therapy offers for addressing culturally based trauma.

Relevant theory and practical strategies will be illuminated by case examples including clips from video-taped clinical sessions.
