How and when were you introduced to male spirituality? I have often been asked how I was introduced to male spirituality. Frankly, I never thought of spirituality as being gender-specific. About 25 years ago, during a time of personal struggle and searching, I came across the book The Quest for the Male Soul by Martin Pable, OFM Cap. In his book he references Richard Rohr's book From Wild Man to Wise Man. I picked up a copy of this book and from the first chapter I was hooked. Richard's straightforward style spoke directly to how I was feeling and what I was experiencing. A few years later, I attended a Man Matters retreat on True Self/False Self, which led to the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius and the MROP in 2005. From that point on, I immersed myself in what is commonly referred to as male spirituality.

How has your participation in Illuman/M.A.L.Es fostered the use and development of your gifts?

As the Northeast started preparing for their first MROP in 2006, I volunteered to work in the background, getting some of the materials and supplies ready for the MROP. Not long after that, I assumed the role of Convener for the Northeast and have been actively "working" in male spirituality locally, regionally, and nationally since that time. My gift of organization and attention to detail is what I offer. If you were to ask someone that knows me well, when it comes to organization, they would agree that I keep the edges hot!

Describe a recent Illuman/M.A.L.Es event you attended. What was the impact on you?

I would have to say that the Conference/Soularize event that was held in November of 2014 had a significant impact on me.
