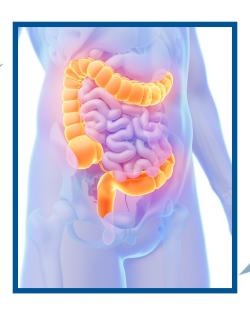

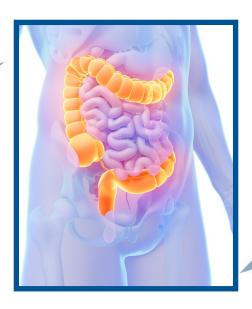
- Colon cancer screening should begin at age 50.
- African Americans should begin screening at the age of 45.
- People with personal or family history of colon cancer, inflammatory bowel disease, or are experiencing symptoms, are considered "high risk" and should begin screening <u>before age 50</u>.

Signs of Colon Cancer

- A change in your bowel movements, including diarrhea or constipation, that lasts more than a few days
- Bleeding during bowel movements
- Dark stool or blood in your stool
- Abdominal (gut) discomfort, such as cramps, gas, or pain, that lasts more than a few days
- A feeling that, when you need to go, you can't or you can't seem to empty it all

- Stools that are more narrow than usual
- Weakness or feeling very tired
- Unexplained weight loss
