





paper, finger on phone — come explore different ways journals, planners and scraps of paper impact our lives.



SARGENT HOUSE KITCHEN

Basics:

Half a dozen dish towels (or more)

4 flour sack dish towels (for use on glassware)

3 or 4 hot pads – (not mitts)

4 professional half sheet plans, 13" x 18" with 1" high sides

(Costco sells 2 for \$10)

4 cookie sheets - minimum 13" x 16 1/2"

1 package barroom felt shamies

Large 4 cup class measuring cup

Set of large mixing bowls

A dozen white ceramic condiment bowls – size of a large cereal bowl

4 or 5 silicone spatulas and spoonulas (must be able to take high heat)

Two chef knives – 9" blade or larger

Two paring knives – 3 to 4" blade

One bread knife – with serrated blade

Wooden chopping board – preferably large (12" x 18" or larger)

Large colander

Strainer with handle

Four sided box grater

Teakettle

Silver Polish

Paper towel holder – Pole to sit on counter


Possible Donations:
