

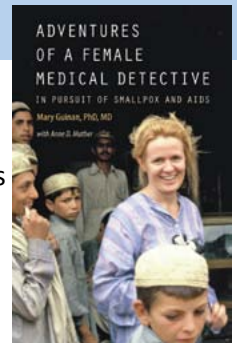


Reach Out to Help Students and Alumnae with Career Guidance

John Hopkins University Press recently released a new book coauthored by **Anne Mather '63**—*Adventures of a Female Medical Detective*.
