December Theme – Theater Productions

Throughout Magnificat High School's 60-year existence, students have been involved in many memorable theater productions. Performers and stage, sound and lighting crews have made the stage come alive with song, dance and lines from plays and musicals.

The fall 2015 production, *Cinderella*, is the most recent in this long tradition, which began with the initial Senior Class play. The front page of the November 4, 1958 edition of the school newspaper, *Magnificat*, includes an article entitled, Seniors to Stage "Seven Sisters" Musical Interlude; this play was directed by Sister Raymund and presented on December 5 and 6. The setting was 1950s Hungary and depicted the social customs surrounding marriage. As stated in the article, "Conflict arises when the six younger sisters plot to find an eligible beau for their older sister...They have found suitors for themselves; but unfortunately, are unable to be courted because the prevailing custom dictates that the oldest girl in the family marry first."
