New Youth Sports Facility in San Pedro

hen our organization was first founded in 1937, athletics was the only enrichment program we offered. Through athletics, our first Club members of the San Pedro Boys Club found fun and productive ways to stay safe and socialize after school. For many of our Club alumni, involvement in our sports programs gave them a purpose and motivation to succeed.

We are proud to announce that on November 14, 2015, we dedicated the new Daniels Field Sports Complex across the street from our San Pedro Club. This \$1.1 million facility, built in collaboration with the City of Los Angeles Department of Recreation and Parks, includes a batting cage, golf driving ranges, futsal court with bleachers, ADA accessible ramp and a picnic area. Funds were primarily raised from grants by the State of California Department of Parks and Recreation and U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development with additional funding by the City of Los Angeles Department of Recreation and Parks, the LA84 Foundation and Major League Baseball Tomorrow Fund.

We dedicated the new facility with much fanfare thanks to the support of Councilman Joe Buscaino and his office. As an alumnus of our San Pedro Club, Councilman Buscaino has worked with Executive Director Mike Lansing for several years to make this plan come to fruition.

Over 300 Club members, Club alumni, classic car enthusiasts and community leaders gathered for our block party and alumni car show to celebrate the opening of the complex. The celebration fell on the 50th anniversary of the dedication date of our current San Pedro Clubhouse on November 14, 1965. Club alumni and Club kids gathered to honor the past while celebrating the future.

Our new facility will be managed by the Department of Recreation and Parks and accessible to organizations with permits for the use of Daniels Field, including our organization which serves over 8,900 youth annually.







Daily Supper Program Serves Over 11,000 Meals Per Month

t's supper time! Every day after school at the Boys & Girls Club we host supper time for hundreds of youth. Our members eagerly file into line to receive supper from our Clubhouse kitchens and sit with their friends to enjoy their afternoon meal.

Good nutrition is not only important to a child's physical health, but also their mental development and ability to achieve in school and later in life. Unfortunately, 15.3 million children in America lived in "food insecure" households in 2014 according to the USDA.

We only charge our Club members \$25 for the school year in order to provide our after-school programs to all youth who need as most. The majority of our Club members are from low-income families who seek our services to help their children reach their full potential.

Our daily supper program is a big part of fulfilling our mission because it ensures that our members have a nutritious, hot meal after school. During the 2014/2015 school year, we served an average of 11,456 every month at our three Clubhouses in San Pedro, Wilmington and the Port of L.A.

Each supper includes a protein, a grain and a fruit to serve as a complete, wholesome meal. We recognize that for many



of our members, this supper and the low-cost lunch they receive through their school reduced/free lunch program are the only two meals they will eat during a school day.

This program affects all of our members and gives us an opportunity to make a difference in their lives as well as their overall health.





Thank You to Our Thanksgiving Champions!

his past Thanksgiving we wanted to make sure our Club families who need us most had something to be thankful for. Our seasonal food drive was a great success thanks to some very generous individuals and organizations.

Thanks to National Charity League Palos Verdes we provided turkeys and boxes of food supplies to over 300 families. NCL provided the vast majority of the food donations and volunteered on the day of distribution to meet some of the families they had so greatly impacted.

We also received generous donations from H&R Block, Todd Diebold from Rio Tinto, Lexus and Marymount California University to ensure we reached all of the families we identified as being most in need this holiday season.

This Thanksgiving also saw the return of our Clubhouse Thanksgiving Dinners thanks to Board members, Bryan Bero and John Vidovich, for donating all of the turkeys to feed over 1,200 youth at our San Pedro, Wilmington and Port of L.A. Clubhouses. The holiday dinners give our members the opportunity to share in a festive meal together.

Being the oldest of six, it's difficult hearing my siblings talking among themselves while they make their Christmas list for Santa.

The holidays mean a lot to me because I get to assimilate the warmth of appreciating my family. Despite the hardships we go through, it has only made me stronger as a person. Thankfully to the Boys & Girls Club, my family was adopted by Councilman Joe Buscaino's office last year. It was one the most fulfilling moments of my life because not only did I get to share such a wonderful moment with my family, but also with the community. Being able to see my siblings go from a sigh to an uplifting smile was an unrivaled time in my life.



I am proud to say that this experience has molded me to be a humble, ardent and ambitious young woman. Moreover, one day I aspire to bring change to the community that I hold dearly to my heart.

The Gift of Reading

hether for pleasure or future success, reading is a skill that must be taught and nurtured. Unfortunately, it is a skill that many in our local public schools lack. According to the 2015 National Assessment of Educational Progress, 79% of 4th graders and 81% of 8th graders in the LAUSD do not read at a proficient level.

Helping our members escape this statistic is crucial. We have taken steps in our after school programs to give our students more focused assistance in reading comprehension.

In the Fall of 2014, we opened our Elementary School Reading Center at the Wilmington Boys & Girls Club. This is a room separate from our other program areas where our students can immerse themselves in reading and receive help in nurturing this crucial skill.

Our elementary school members who participate in the Wilmington Club program are required to read several books per week and demonstrate their understanding of the stories. Their progress is tracked and shared with their parents. For many of the families we serve in Wilmington, English is a second language. It is important that we impress upon our Club parents the significance of their child's reading comprehension so that they may support that education at home.

Reading in our Club isn't the only way we are nurturing our members' reading skills. Every Thursday the Wilmington Club students who have been active in the program are taken on a field trip to the Wilmington branch of the Los Angeles Public Library. For almost all of these students, their first field trip to the library was the first time they had ever visited a public library and applied for library card.



As our youth age, we provide more advanced reading programs. Diana Chapman at our San Pedro Club has been one of our most dedicated volunteers for several years. She hosts writers workshops for both our middle and high schools students. Our high school centers also host book clubs to remind our students of the value of leisurely reading.

We have been fortunate to have received support for our after-school reading programs. This holiday season we gave our students the "Gift of Reading" with a brand new book to take home thanks to a very generous donation from the Molina Foundation. We received 2,994 books for elementary and middle school students. The majority of these books were given to the students at our school sites to encourage reading over the holiday break with their families.
