The first session in October reviewed a visitation at the beginning of a case. Also reviewed basic development of attachment and the factors affecting quality care. This next session will focus on visitation in the middle of a case. Many factors may influence decision-making in child welfare, but we believe an important and underutilized source of information is what we know from developmental science about what is helpful and harmful to children's development. Future session will consider implications for protective settings for placement, for transitions from one placement to the next, and for sibling placement.
